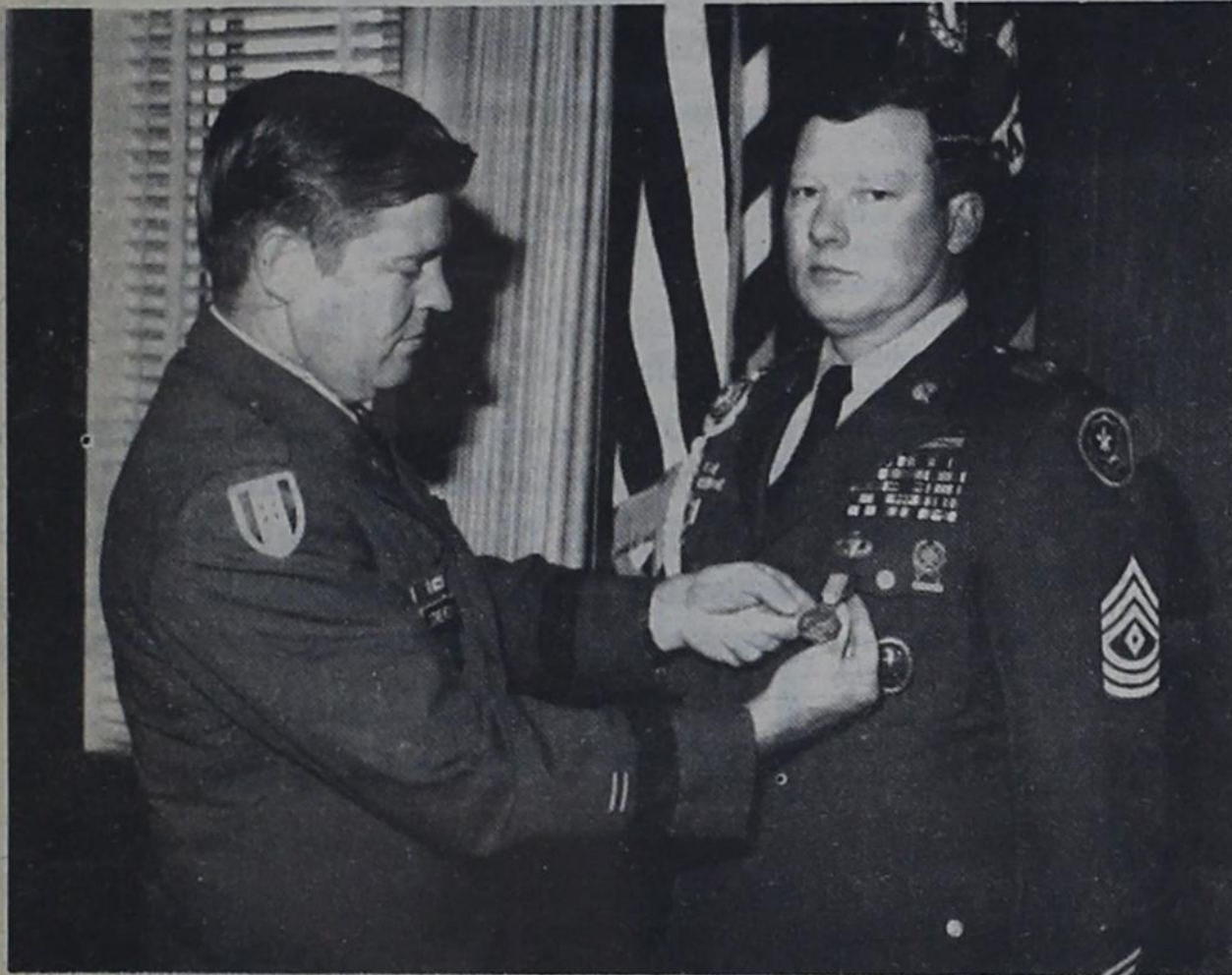

Holland led the scoring with 11 points followed ever so closely by Fears with 10 pts. Ester Mendez and Tresa Hatchett played steady defense and penetrating offense as the two guards kept the pressure on all night. Hatchett was also the leading rebounder with 7. 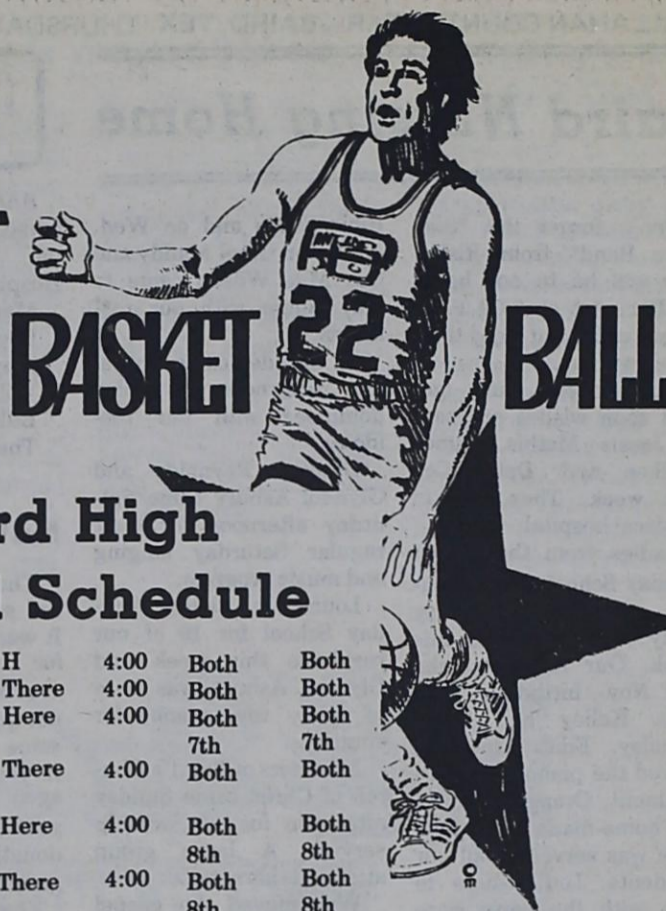

Louise Joy taught Sunday School for 19 of our residents this week and Glyndol Asbury was here to play the piano for singing.

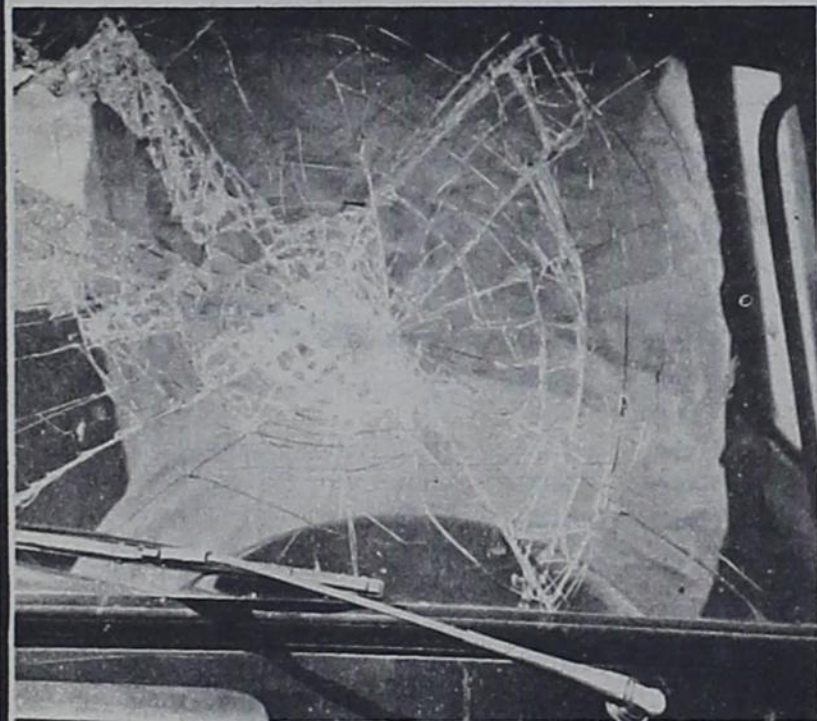

Baird Native Decorated For Heroism, Awaits Review Boards Decision

A highly decorated veteran of the Vietnam War from Baird has been decorated again, this time for heroism during a recent assignment in Germany.

First Sergeant Jimmy L. Collins, son of Denver and Amy Collins, P.O. Box 665, has been awarded the Soldiers Medal for his attempted rescue of soldiers believed trapped in a burning ammunition carrier.

He was presented with his medal by Brig. Gen. Tracy E. Strevey Jr., commander of Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio. Collins is currently a liaison noncommissioned officer with Brooke's Plans, Operations and Training Division.

At the time of his heroic actions on March 27, 1982, he was first sergeant of C Troop, 1st Squadron, 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment, Grafwwoehr Training Area in Germany.

According to his citation, Collins heard

explosions from a burning ammunition carrier near his unit. He immediately drove his jeep within 75 feet of the burning vehicle and "...with total disregard for his own safety and life, he grabbed a portable fire extinguisher from his jeep and ran toward the burning ammunition carrier to insure that all crew members were safe and to render assistance."

The heat from the burning vehicle was so intense that it forced him back to his jeep where he radioed his commander. At that time, numerous small explosions occurred with a final violent explosion which sent shrapnel in all directions.

Collins received a serious wound to his right arm and severe wound to his right leg below the knee which required amputation later that day. "Still conscious and in unbearable pain, he directed

emergency first aid treatment of his own wounds while continuing to express concern for the safety of the soldiers that he believed were near the vehicle."

Collins was subsequently evacuated to Brooke where he recovered from his injuries, has been fitted with an artificial limb and in his own words is "...ready to go back to my unit."

Collins is a graduate of Baird High School and has taken courses at the University of Texas in Austin.

He has been in the Army for 17 years and in addition to his Soldiers Medal, he has previously been awarded the Silver Star, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, four Purple Hearts, the Expeditionary Forces Medal (Dominican Republic of Korea), Vietnam Service Ribbon, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm, five Good Conduct Medals, the Combat Infantryman's Badge and the

Senior Parachutist Wings.

Collins served five and half years in Vietnam with the Fifth Special Forces. He was wounded four times there and medically evacuated to Brooke three times and to Tachikawa Air Base, Japan, once. He has also served tours in Korea and Thailand and Fort Carson, Colo., Fort Benning, Ga., and in Austin, Texas.

Collins is married to the former Monika E. Holhut of Kuferberg, Germany. As hobbies, he "...likes to do almost everything..." but especially skeet shooting, free falling and parachuting, hunting, bow hunting and scuba diving.

He is currently waiting for an Army medical review board to decide whether he can remain on active duty. He wants to stay in the Army and return to his unit in Germany. "If I can't stay in the Army," he says, "I'll go back home and join my father in the ranching business near Baird."

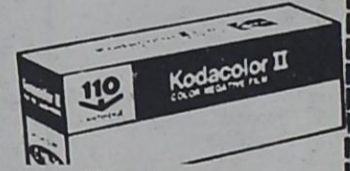
