Mr. B. K. Eubank, who lives in the Dressv community, planted an experimental patch of wheat of an part of his 1921 crop. Only five acres ot land was seeded and a total veild of 301.2 bushels per acre was harvested and threshed from was patch. The seed wheat for the crop was purchased wheat for the crop was purchased from a seed concern
in Miami, Texas, in Miami, Texas, it is known as produced 30 . While this wheat produced $301-2$ bushels per acre, ordinary wheat on the adjoining land that was planted by Mr. R. O. Eubank, tather of B. K. Eubank, only produced $251-2$ bushels per
acre. acre.
Several kushels of the Canred Wheat sold the day that it was threshed for $\$ 2.00$ per bu., while the price oftered for the ordinary wheat was only $\$ 1.00$. Only 3.4 of a bushel of the Canred Wheat was used per acre in seeding the land while one bushel of the ordinary seed was used on each acre seeded This experiment by Mr. Eubanh has proven to be a very profitable one; and no doubt it will prove to be a great benefit to the wheat growers of this section.
