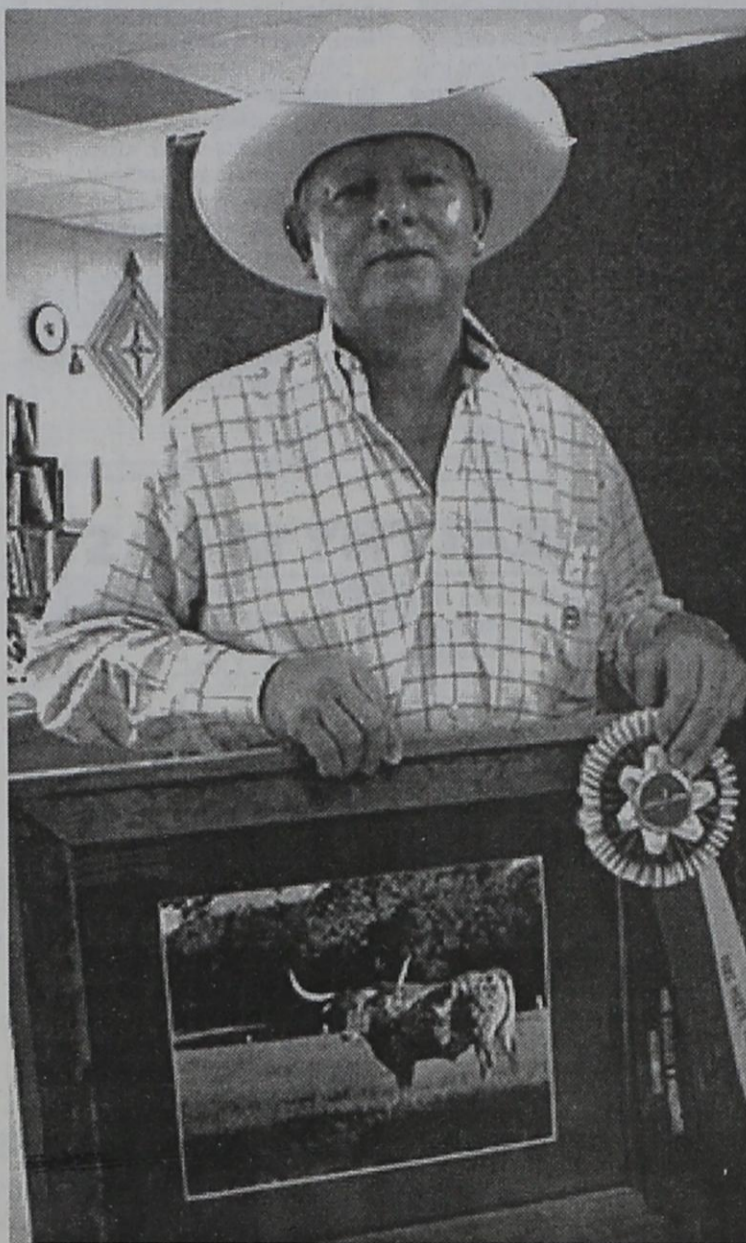

COWBOY'S GUARDIAN ANGELS

I ranch in the Carbon area and manage several cattle operations; two in Carbon, two in Gordon, and one in Sidney.

On Monday, June 27, 2005, at approximately 7:00 a.m., I was riding over the Carbon place, looking for my herd.

At about 12:00 noon, my four year old gelding spooked and began bucking. I probably stayed in the saddle for four or five bucks.

On the last buck, I went off to the left and hit the ground hard! I rose to my feet, the world started to spin and I passed straight out.

When I awoke, I knew I was hurt badly, but didn't know just how bad. It was everything I could do to crawl about 25 yards to the base of a big oak tree.

I knew that God was with me when I got to the shade because it was about 100 degrees that noon. Once I got under the shade of the tree, my pain was so excruciating that I could hardly breathe. I tried to prop myself up on the tree trunk as good as I could.

Ants were crawling all over me. My Catahoula cow dog, Seven, used his nose to lift me up out of the ants and continuously licked my face to keep me conscious.—

By the time a rancher, Mr. Lynn Williamson found me at 6:30 p.m. that evening, I was completely dehydrated

and in shock. He realized immediately that I was hurt badly and needed medical attention and called an ambulance. When the ambulance arrived, my dog growled at the paramedics to protect me. I had been praying to God the entire day that someone would find me and spare my life. I prayed that He would give this cowboy one more chance. When Mr. Williamson found me, I knew that He had answered my prayers.—

I was careflighted by helicopter to Hendrick Hospital in Abilene and was admitted to the trauma unit. I was so dehydrated that all of my vital signs were failing. I was given seven units of fluid and was stabilized by the wonderful trauma staff.

I was told by the Dr. that there had truly been guardian angels watching over me that day because if I had been out there any longer, I would not have made it.

I had six broken ribs, a bruised lung and spleen, and had internal bleeding.

I know that God had a plan for this cowboy and that was to give him one more chance.

I am indebted to all who were there to heal me and help me make it back home again!
