County Expected To Host Some 120 Hurricane Evacuees



Churches of Christ Planning To House Evacuees at Cisco Christian Camp

Citizens Urged To Donate Funds Towards Project To Special Account

Eastland's Courthouse Square was filled with vehicles Monday afternoon on what would have otherwise been a quiet Labor Day holiday.

The response came as a hurry up call from County Judge Brad Stephenson calling an emergency meeting of the Emergency Preparedness Committee to map plans for receiving an additional 150 citizens displaced by the recent hurricane which devastated much of Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama, and virtually wiped out the entire city of New Orleans.

The Churches of Christ of this area had already agreed to accept 150 refugees, with plans to house them at least temporarily at the Christian Camp at Lake Cisco Park which is maintained and utilized by the Churches of Christ.

Judge Stephenson said he was called by the Governor's office asking if Eastland County could accept additional displaced persons. The State of Texas has already accepted literally thousands of persons from the damaged areas.

Initial plans according to Judge Stephenson was to place some at the old Carbon School building which is now owned and used by a church group in Carbon, which he said had already agreed to assist by providing some housing. Another site being looked at was the camp cabins at what was Camp Inspiration on the west side of Eastland, now owned by the Eastland Economic Development Corp.

Additional sites may come available, he said, but announced Tuesday that this was probably not needed at the moment.

The entire population of

the county will be asked to assist by providing basic necessary living supplies, as well as food, clothing, medicines and other things for these people who have lost virtually everything including their homes to the tremendous storm.

In an emergency Eastland County Commissioners' Meeting on Tuesday, September 6, Commissioners voted to take over the financial operation of the project to house 120 evacuees from the hurricane devastated region of Baton Rouge, LA at the Church of Christ Christian Camp near Cisco. This would help assure FEMA reimbursement of funds for the project, County Judge Brad Stephenson explained to the Court.

The Court also voted to take \$10,000 out of a County Poor Farm CD, which would be put in the County Poor Farm operating account for the evacuee project.

\$2,000 would be used for the trip to Baton Rouge to pick up the evacuees and bring them to Eastland County.

Ranger College has given the use of their athletic buss for the trip to Baton Rouge. An air-conditioned bus from Ranger I. S. D. is also being provided, as well as vans from various local churches.

Several law officers from the County will accompany the transportation, as well as EMS personnel, local doctors and other support staff.

Persons wishing to give funds to the Christian Camp evacuee project are urged to donate them to an account set up especially for the project at First National Bank of Cisco. The account number is: 548-491001. Please earmark donations "relief fund".

Here is another way to help the victims of the hurricane:

The Cisco Church of Christ is opening their camp to provide shelter for the homeless. They could be here at least a month.

Items that are needed:

Canned goods, toiletries, sheets, blankets, and fans (there is no A.C.). These are just a few items to mention.

You can take your donations to the Cisco Church of Christ.

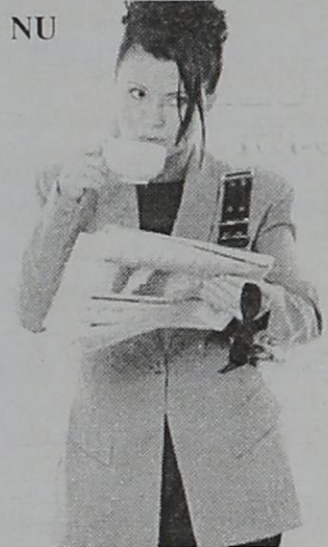

'Fall Back' and Pay Off Your Sleep Debt



'Fall Back' and Pay Off Your Sleep Debt

(NUI) - Once a year, sleepy Americans get their wish for "just one more hour of sleep," thanks to the end of daylight-saving time.

While it might be tempting to use that extra hour to watch TV or read, health experts stress the importance of using that time to actually sleep.

"Getting this extra hour of sleep is a good start, but you must prioritize sleep every day to pay off your sleep debt," said Dr. Lawrence Epstein, president of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM). "If you experience difficulty initiating or maintaining sleep, go see a sleep specialist."

To a society that is already sleep-deprived, losing just an hour more of sleep can be detrimental. A study conducted at the University of British Columbia found an estimated 7 percent increase in traffic accidents immediately following the spring daylight-saving time shift - when we lose one hour of sleep.

** Avoid caffeine within four to six hours of bedtime, and don't exercise within six hours of bedtime. Also, don't eat a big meal right before bed.*

** Stick to rituals that help you relax each night before bed. This can include such things as a warm bath, a light snack or a few minutes of reading.*

** Don't take your worries to bed. Bedtime is a time to relax, not to hash out the stresses of the day.*

** If you can't fall asleep, leave your bedroom and engage in a quiet activity. Return to bed only when you are drowsy.*

** Minimize light, noise and extreme temperatures in the bedroom.*

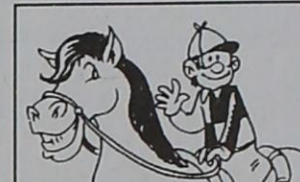

San Francisco: Paradise for Diners

San Francisco Convention and Visitors' Bureau is a "class act." Contact these folks when planning visits there, warned in advance that they provide information by the reams. Try to digest it all at once, and expect to choke.

First, let me suggest that one of their stats is, well, wrong! They claim that the #1 reason some 16 million people visit each year is for "atmosphere and ambiance," followed by "restaurants, scenic beauty and diversity." If allowances are made for fibbing, "restaurants" zoom to the front, finishing ahead by several lengths....

Most people go there to "chow down," like the wife and I did. Diners surveyed

at each restaurant agreed. We were all there to eat, with options of taking in the "atmosphere/ambiance/scenic beauty/diversity" between meals—or between bites.

Letting down of hair in SF is optional; letting out of belts is non-negotiable. It is a city with only a few "good" restaurants. These are all in transition, on their way to greatness—or closure.

Late TV chef Julia Child asked, "Who couldn't become ravenous in such a place?" Emeril Lagasse flatly claims, "You can't have a bad meal in this town."

Granted, restaurateurs may have seen the celebrity chefs coming, with much fawning following. For us—a couple of gawkers from Texas—it seemed like all

diners were treated like royalty....

We signed up for the "Local Tastes of the City" tour, a thinly-disguised excuse for four hours of continuous nibbling at a dozen stops. We learned that "fresh and local" is preferable to "frozen and imported."

And that sourdough bread must be baked in "just so" brick ovens...and that the BEST cup of coffee is no accident. "Musts" are Columbian beans, then "just right" roasting and grinding....

Getting around the city is half the fun. It has a sophisticated public transportation system, and if it rolls, floats or flies, it can be bought, rented or jumped on.

We loved the cable cars, thankful for straps to "hold on" as we inched along the tracks. The car operators, with maneuvers limited to starting and stopping up and down the hills amongst the traffic, are colorful and observant—particularly of motorists. "Born in the shallow end of the gene pool," they joke.

One woman balked, fearing electrocution if "her foot touched the rail." "You'll be fine, lady," a resident advised, "If you don't swing your other leg over that wire above the cable car...."

The 132-year-old system is now the only remaining "rolling national monument" in the country. Formerly, there were two—according to the Department of the Interior—but Hurricane Katrina's deadening number on New Orleans stopped the streetcars there.

Now, the only operative cable cars in the world are in the city by the bay....

Ah, watching and listening are predictable delights around the world, and the best sights and sounds cost nothing. In 'Frisco, we hear the voices of many cultures in a paradise where thermometers seem stuck on 70 degrees.

I admit it; it was fun thinking of friends back home, sweating out 100+ degree days.

We needed sleeves by day and sweaters by night. As fog swirled in each evening, we thought of Carl Sandburg, who wrote of its "catlike" entry.

"The coldest winter I ever spent was a summer in San Francisco," said Mark Twain—or somebody! Some credit the quote to H. L. Mencken or Will Rogers. I dunno....

Upon arrival at the Hotel Mark Twain, a quaint place a couple of blocks from Union Square, we spotted two gigantic lobby photos—head shots of Twain and so-loist Billie Holiday. The former liked to write in 'Frisco; the latter enjoyed singing there. (She was featured in the nation's best-known showrooms around

the world for a quarter-century starting in the 30's.)

Her fondness for the Mark Twain, though, was deep. Early in her career, Black persons, no matter how famous or talented, found most hotels to be "off limits." Not the Mark Twain, however. She felt welcome there, and so did we....

We have sweet dreams of returning to San Francisco to "see and do," but mostly to eat. In the meantime, we'll visit websites of world-class eateries, salivating at recollecting expertly-prepared delectables at such places as McCormick & Kuleto's, Kokkari, Trader Vic's, Ana Mandara and Moose's.

We also remember zany street entertainers, happy people in the parks, and a sign posted in front of huge bins of organically-grown

fruit: "Shoplifters will be com:posted."

Before you ask, yes, we completed the SFCVB's survey, tellin' 'em it was the best food we ever lapped our lips over. Author Rudyard Kipling got it right: "San Francisco has just one drawback—'tis hard to leave...."

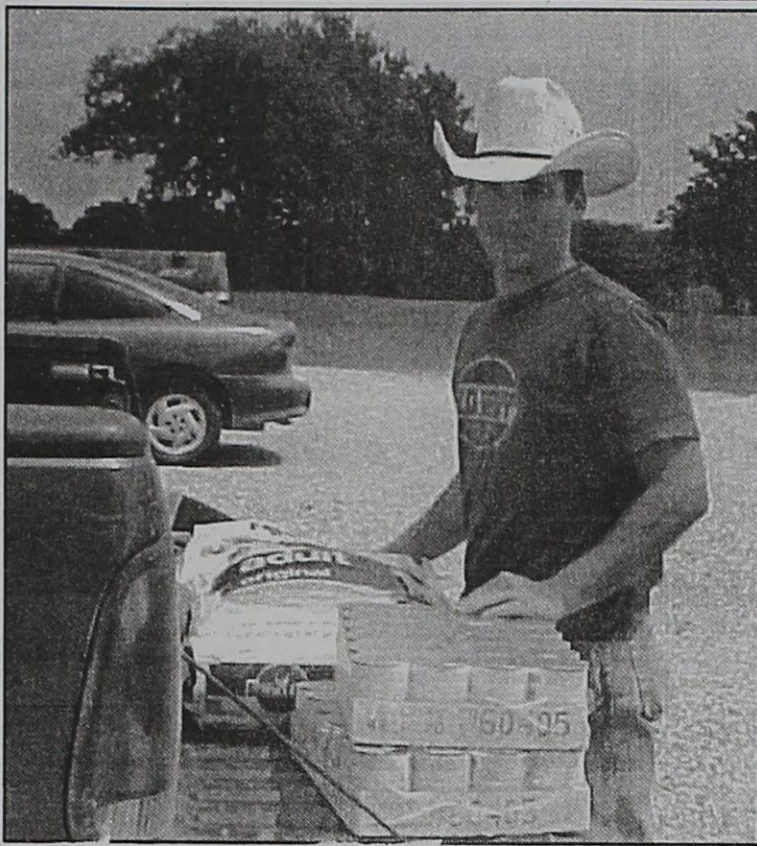
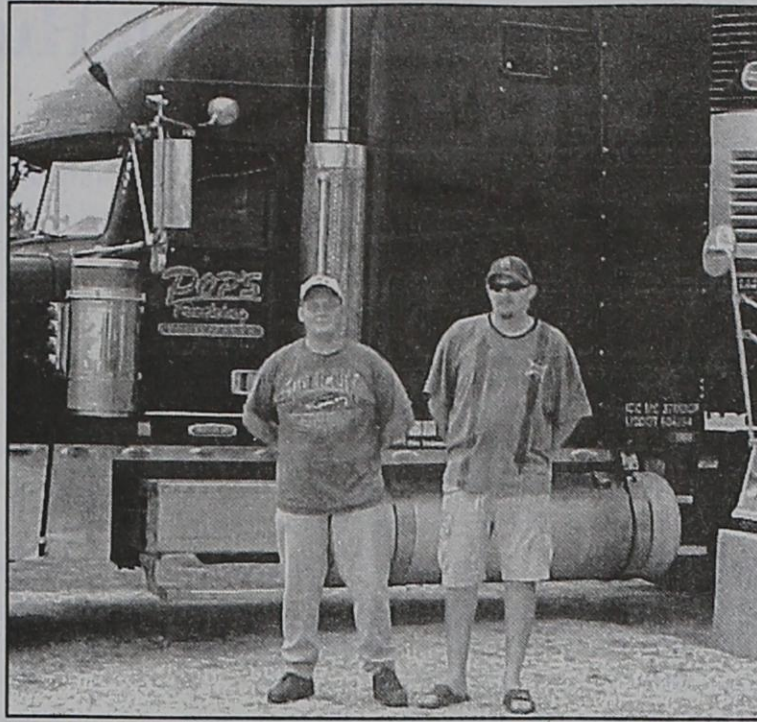

If you would like to donate cash, please do so with one of our local charities. We have made arrangements with the following associates to be local drop off points in our community: Carbon Trade Center located in Carbon, City Hall located in Ranger, First Assembly of God Church located in Cisco, the Courthouse located here in Eastland, First Financial Bank located here in Eastland as well as Pop's House of Catfish located on Highway 6 between Eastland and Cisco. We hope to have our first truck of supplies leaving by 2 p.m. on Sunday, September 3rd. We will continue accepting items until 5 p.m. on September 6th at the above listed locations. If the Lord is willing and the people of our community give as we believe they will, we will ship a second load on September 7th.

Texans Of Faith Invited To Share Stories, Experiences

(Part 1)

Texas of all cultures and religious faiths are invited to submit personal stories of their individual practices for a new book, "Amazing Faith of Texas," to be published by one of the state's leading marketing experts.

Roy Spence, founder and president of Austin based marketing agency GSD&M, and his colleagues will collect and publish the series of personal essays and portraits in the new book early next year.

"In our work across Texas over the past three decades, we have been blessed to witness and be immersed in the vivid color and character of our state's diverse cultures," Spence said. "And we have been struck often by the richness and variety of faiths embraced and practiced by those cultures."

"Now, at a time when we too often hear voices attempt to amplify our differences, it is fitting that we recognize and celebrate the remarkable faith of Texas, and we need the help of our fellow Texans in this endeavor."

Spence said the project is an attempt to build a common purpose around the variety of faiths. He said the venture reflects his concern for a perceived drift toward cultural wars over religion, currently fueled by fears of extremists around the world.

"It is my hope that in some small way, we can help bring our state and nation closer together in recognizing that while we may have differences in how we practice our faiths, we need to be aware that we're all in this together."

Spence said that a special writer-photographer team will be dedicated to gathering selected stories across the state in the weeks to come. He stressed that the book is a pro-bono, not for profit undertaking.
