 Child abuse is failure to pro- that may hide injuries to vide for a child's basic needs. There are four major types of child maltreatment: physical abuse, neglect, sexual abuse and emotional abuse. Physical Abuse is physica injury that results in substantial harm to the child or the genuine threat of substantial harm from physical injury to the child. The physical injury (ranging from minor bruises to severe fractures or death) can result from punching, beat ing, shaking, kicking, biting, throwing, stabbing, hitting burning, choking or otherwise harming a child. Such injury is considered abuse regardless o whether the caretaker intended to hurt the child.Suspect Physical Abuse When You See:
© Frequent injuries such as bruises, cuts, black eyes or burns without adequate ex planations
Frequent complaints of pain without obvious injury
-Burns or bruises in unusual patterns that may indicate the use of an instrument or human bite; cigarette burns on any part of the body
