Texas News

The annual meeting of the state for... was held at Beaumont last week.

The annual meeting of the Texas Cotton Association was held in Galveston last week.

Bond issues for road improvements aggregating more than \$310,000 were voted in four districts in Collin county last week.

The famous Dimmit county strawberries have begun to ship. The first to be shipped were sent out a few days ago from Carrizo Springs, Texas.

Work on the hydroplane station at Galveston has been stopped by reason of the failure of the naval appropriation bill in the closing hours of congress.

Land sales and leases for the month of February in Texas amounted to \$145,938, of which \$78,138 went to the various available funds and \$67,799 to the permanent funds.

For the purpose of teaching the English language to all foreigners who are unable to speak it in Washington county, a school of instruction will be opened in Brenham March 17.

The railroad commission has granted the application of the Rio Grande Railroad Company to issue and register 125,430 mortgage bonds on a valuation of \$205,430. The road operates between Brownsville and Point Isabel, a distance of 225 miles.

A complete survey of the Lower Rio Grande Valley of Texas, to determine the feasibility of irrigating by gravity flow 1,000,000 acres of agricultural land located in Starr, Hidalgo and Cameron counties and generally known as the Rio Grande delta, will take place within a few weeks.

What is said to be the world's record for work done under water has just been achieved at Orange, where Guy Hoover placed fifty-six bolts in piling for a set of shipways in a period of six and a half hours. Hoover remained under water for four hours the first time and two and a half hours the second.

A pecan tree of thin-shell variety has been planted in the park at Balinger for every soldier from the county who lost his life in the army. The trees will bear same plates for the soldiers in whose honor they were planted and given particular care until they gain a good growth. Twenty-seven men from the county were killed or died in the service.

Now that the bronze statue to the late Governor L. S. Ross has been mounted in its permanent position in front of the academic building of A. and M. College at College Station, of which institution the ex-governor was the honored president for several years, it has been definitely decided to unveil the statue Monday, April 21, which is San Jacinto day.

Five thousand bales of cotton and 75,337 sacks of breadstuffs constituted the first cargo to depart from Galveston since August, 1914. The cargo, together with 1,351 pieces of gum damage lumber, according to the ship's manifest, was carried by the Grey-stoke Castle, Captain A. G. Howe, which stood out to sea Friday.

That a vast field of operation has been mapped out for exploiting the resources of Texas, concerning the location of important industries and reaching the markets of the world with Texas products with the organization of the Texas Chamber of Commerce, is the statement of James Z. George, who was elected general manager of the State organization at a recent meeting in Dallas.

Williamson county is making special efforts this year in the direction of growing high-grade cotton and breeding pure seed, and for increasing interest along the line clubs of boys under 15 are being formed throughout the county who are to experiment on three-acre plots of land. Government certified pure seed is to be furnished and the boys instructed in cultivating their crops by an expert cotton man.

The attorney general's department has just handed out a ruling to the effect that the fish in the waters of the state and the game in its forests belong to the people of the state in their sovereign capacity, who, through their representatives, the legislators, have sole control thereof, and may permit or prohibit their taking. The opinion holds that it is unlawful for any person in the state of Texas to take or destroy the nest or eggs of any wild bird, or have such nest or eggs in his or her possession, except English house sparrows, hawks, crows, buzzards, blackbirds, rice birds and owls.

Five good road projects in Harris county are receiving either state or federal aid. The estimated cost of these projects is \$482,184.55. With state aid in road work amounting to \$79,087.16 and federal aid amounting to \$390,000, a grand total of \$129,087.16 is reached in the county. These figures represent only a part of the road work being done in Harris county, as there are many projects for which no aid, either state or federal, has been

PAY AND FILE INCOME TAX BEFORE MAR. 15

U. S. Internal Revenue Bureau Gives Warning That Severe Penalties Will Be Enforced.

WOMEN WITHIN LAW'S SCOPE; HOW THEY REPORT INCOME

The Income Tax drive comes to a close on Saturday night, March 15. All payments and returns due on that date under the provisions of the new Revenue Law must be in the hands of local Internal Revenue Collectors before their offices close that night.

Where to Pay and File. Residents of Texas are required to make their returns and pay their taxes to Alexander S. Walker, Collector of Internal Revenue, Austin, Tex., or to deputy collectors who are now doing free advisory work on Income Tax.

Women Pay Tax. Women are subject to all the requirements of the Income Tax. Whether single or married, a woman's income from all sources must be considered.

Severe Penalties. The new Revenue Law places severe penalties on a person who fails to make return on time, refuses to make return or renders a fraudulent return.

Over-time and Bonus Taxed. Salary and wage earners must consider as taxable every item received from employers and from other sources.

Allowances for Losses. Losses sustained in 1918 and not covered by insurance are deductible items if incurred in the taxpayer's business or trade.

***** SQUARE DEAL FOR EVERY INCOME TAX PAYER ***** Washington, D. C. — "The rights of all persons now filing Income Tax returns are amply protected by provisions for abatements, refunds and penalties," says Commissioner Daniel C. Hooper.

***** "Every person can be sure of a square deal. No person is expected to pay more than his share of tax. His share is determined solely by the amount and nature of his net income for 1918, as defined in the law." ***** Abatement petitions are dealt with open-mindedly.
