**OIL SUIT SETTLED**  
The oil interests in the north part of the county as well as in other counties in the oil belt have been set at rest finally by a decision, by state supreme court last week to the effect that state could not hold the mineral rights in lands sold to settlers under the act of 1883. The decision is a wise one.  
Only last week a party from Austin came to Baird and filed on parts of forty seven sections of land, most or all of which was in the B. H. & H. Asylum lands, some of which is very valuable because of its proximity to the Putnam well. The people in the Putnam country were very much exorcised over this man's efforts. Judge B. L. Russell, Mr. Hart, proprietor of the Hart ranch, where a well is being drilled, and another party went to Austin last of the week to see into the matter. All is well that ends well, and so we are ready for more development.

**A GOOD RECORD**  
Grady Travis, who returned to his home in Cross Plains week before last after being discharged from service and who has been three months in France, has a record he can always be proud of as a marksman. He belonged to Co. M, 49th Inf. In his regiment of four thousand and another soldier Willie Gibson of Dallas County, tied in all shooting contests. They tried their skill in a number of shooting events and invariably tied. They first tied in a range shooting at Camp Cook, N. M. in 200, 300, and 400 yards they scored perfect.  
They also made perfect record at Camp Dix, N. J. before sailing for France. On second day out from New York on way to France they tried their marksmanship on sea gulls about 200 yards distant from their ship, which was going at about 12 knots. They got three out of five. On range in France they got 16 bulls eyes and one "4" out of a possible 17, in a minute and ten seconds. The "4" means they got in three inches of the bull's eye. The Colonel of the regiment said he was going to have them to shoot off the tie if it took two weeks, but Grady was discharged soon after arriving at Camp Fort Leavenworth Kansas, and thus the tie will not likely be untied soon.

He wears the marksmanship medal, and of course is very proud of it. It is well for the Huns that the Armistice was signed before these Texans got a shot at them. They would have a poor chance of a fight against such marksmen.
