HOW TEACHERS' SALARIES MAY BE INCREASED

Austin, June 17.—Teachers' salaries may be increased in schools with less than 500 pupils, and one half the increase to be met by the state provided certain requirements are met. Schools eligible to receive aid from the rural aid fund may obtain it for salary increase not to exceed more than one-half the salary increases; provided no school shall receive more than \$500 in one year for this purpose. Further requirements are that state aid applies only to increases made reelected teachers who have made cert in professional advancement during the year. Trustees should keep these facts in mind when electing teachers and fixing salaries for the coming school year.

NEWS FROM THE OIL WELL

There is nothing sensational. Vestal No 1 is on the pump, said to be pumping 100 barrels a day, 50 per cent of which is water. It is believed that the water trouble will finally be overcome at which time the well will again flow oil as it did at first. The Greenlee No. 1 on T. J. Harris farm has been making excellent progress up to recent date. They are now between 1600 and 1700 feet and have shut down because of a lot of bad casing which has been put off on them. Mr. Greenlee states that good casing will be procured as early as possible and work will be resumed.

The consolidated Barr is still shut down at 1460 feet waiting on the crew. We are informed by S. P. Rumph, that work on this well is expected to start again soon.

The W. C. Templeman oil corporation, J. H. Lee No. 1 have been drilling the past few weeks at about 1500 feet.

The Litzinger J. N. Gooch No. 1, four miles east of town is said to be between 900 and 1000 feet. We have been informed that they are making good progress. Qdom No. 1, not drilling.

NATIONAL DISASTER FOLLOW-UP FAILURE OF LARGER PRODUCTION

Unless agricultural production is encouraged and the consuming public abandons its indifference to the farmers' problems, "nothing will prevent national disaster," said the agriculture commissioner. In a statement the commissioner declared the farmers' financial return for the amount of labor he does is insufficient, unless this is remedied, he added, a continued decrease in production is inevitable.

"A farmers' strike is on," Commissioner Davis said, "and will continue until the inequality between the country and the city is removed. Of course the farmers have not called a strike as the industrial workers do. It is a strike by means of the abandonment of productive effort. The farmer has decided the odds are too much against him, and feeling that he can never get adequate remuneration for his labor, he quits."

Mr. Davis declared he was astonished at the indifference shown by the general public over the diminishing margin between production and consumption. This indifference he said, is "still more astonishing among our so called statesmen and leaders."

Unless this order is changed only one other course remains if famine is to be averted, the commissioner continued "If producers are not assisted in securing remuneration for their toil, he said, the only means for averting a famine is the importation of farmers from the Orient, who are willing to work under conditions which would pauperize and degrade the American farmer." — Fort Worth Record

The above is no doubt a true statement of conditions on the farm, and the note of warning is timely, but we should bear in mind that it is not so much the low price of farm products as it is the high price of farm labor that has brought about this condition. The farmer gets a good price for all farm products, but he must pay so much for production, that he must get more for what he sells or quit the farm.

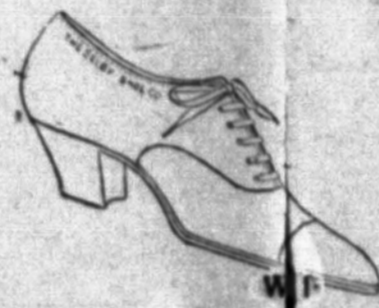

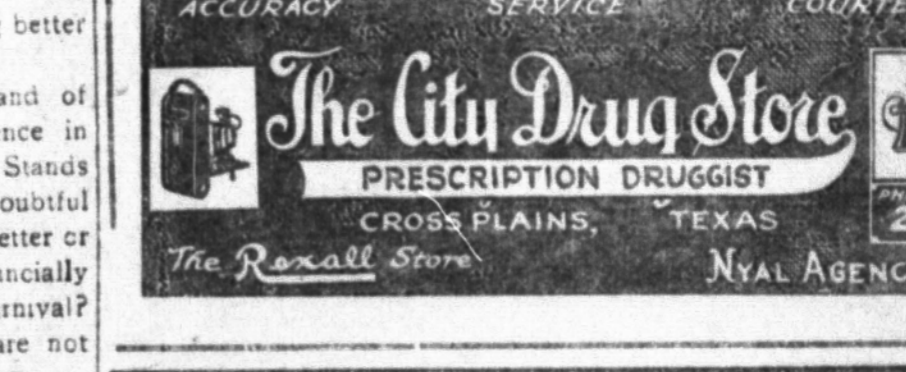
