**ARMY TO EDUCATE ILLITERATES**

Beginning with July 20th the Army will accept illiterates for enlistment for a period of three years and will send them to any place in the United States that they desire to serve. Before joining their organizations they will be sent to school and given instructions so that they will be able to read and write the English language. It will not be necessary to be full citizens but they must have taken out their first papers.

During the war it was found that about FIVE PER CENT of the soldiers could not read or write the English language beyond their own name and as a result, a school was established at Camp Upton, N. Y. where for the last year, men of this type, both American and Foreign born, have been taught the rudiments of becoming good American citizens. This school has been so successful that the activities have been extended to the entire Army, and new schools will be opened up at Camps Jackson, S. C.; Pike, Ark.; Grant, Ill.; Travis, Tex. and Lewis, Wash. Here the illiterates who are accepted for the army will be given a course in elementary English, and instruction in the duties of a soldier and then forwarded to their organization.

It is thought that this is not only a great need of the country that will be filled by improving the class of citizens, but it is also a wonderful opportunity for the men in view of the fact that upon completion of their elementary work they will be able to take advanced courses in the Educational and vocational schools now being carried on in the Army. Men that are graduates of these schools are given a certificate of proficiency that insures them of a good position as a skilled workman at almost any plant employing men who are specialists in their type of work.

Examination

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for Callahan County, Texas, to be held at Cross Plains, Abilene on Aug. 14 1920 to position of rural carrier.

occur on rural routes from other post offices in the above-mentioned county. The examination will be open only to citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in form No. 1970. Both men and women, if qualified, may enter this examination, but appointing officers have the legal right to specify the sex desired in requesting certification of eligibles. Women will not be considered for rural carrier appointment unless they are the widows of U. S. soldiers, sailors, or marines, or the wives of U. S. soldiers, sailors, or marines who are physically disqualified for examination by reason of injuries received in the line of military duty. Form No. 1977 and application blanks may be obtained from the offices mentioned above or from the United States Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C. Applications should be forwarded to the Commission at Washington at the earliest practicable date.

### Discovery Well at Big Springs

Big Springs, July 3.—Swabbing of the General Oil Company's McDowell No. 1 was continued today, and the well is now claimed to be good for 500 barrels daily, with indications that it may do even better.

Several hundred barrels of oil flowed from the well during the two days swabbing.

The people of Big Springs are elated over the showing. The well will be put on the pump within the next few days. Large storage tanks are being built to take care of the output which will be used as fuel oil by the General Oil Company and other drilling operators in the Big Springs field.

All the big companies have representatives on the ground and Big Springs has suddenly found itself in the midst of an oil boom with leases finding an active market.

Four additional wells are being drilled on the McDowell ranch by the General Oil Company of Houston, and eight other companies have wells down to pay sand.—Olden Advance.

Plant Pure Cotton Seed

While harvesting of the cotton crop has not yet begun in some sections of the State, salesmen are now in the field making contracts for cotton seed for planting next year's crop. This makes it timely for me to bring to your attention the opportunity to render great service to the cotton industry in the State by inducing farmers to purchase and plant pure seed of good varieties of cotton.

A little more than 2,500,000 bushels of planting cotton seed are purchased annually by Texas farmers, the greater part of which is mixed as to variety and quality. It is entirely possible to increase the value of the Texas cotton crop from \$5.00 to \$25.00 a bale by the use of better planting seed. This great volume of new wealth can be brought into existence without any additional cost in money and labor. The way to secure this added value for your community is to bring about co-operation between business men who handle seed and the farmers who plant cotton and have brought into your vicinity supplies of pure seed of varieties adapted to the soil and climate, giving preference to those varieties that will yield a staple from 1 1/8 to 1 1/2 inches in length. The supply of seed of cotton of this character is limited, and in order to purchase in quantity, orders must be placed within the next two months, the earlier the better.
