County Agent Column

We'll all do well to look at our arborvitae, cedars and evergreen cypresses—the chances are they are infested with red spiders or cedar bagworms or both.  
The red spider is tiny, so you'll have to use a magnifying glass to see him. The chances are that the first you'll know of the red spider being with you is that you'll notice the leaves of your cedars turning first gray, then brown, and to make it harder, that will start in the center of the plant. The spider does its best—or worst—in dry, warm weather.  
A hard beating rain will check the red spider. So will a good strong stream of water if hosed on the plants twice a week. Or you can dust with the following mixture: 1 1/4 teaspoon nicotine, 1 oz. soap, to one gallon of water.  
There's another insect that is causing a lot of trouble on cedars this year and that's the cedar bagworm. The cedar bagworm, you know, is the insect that has been the housing shortage. It builds its own home and camouflages it with bits of leaves and twigs. When resting it ties up on the tree. To control it, spray with two or three level teaspoons of lead arsenate to a gallon of water.  
As the bagworm gets older, the poison seems to bother it less. If you have a lot of old tough bagworms, and not too many arborvitae or cedars, your best bet is to pick them off. Dunk them in Kerosene or burn them.

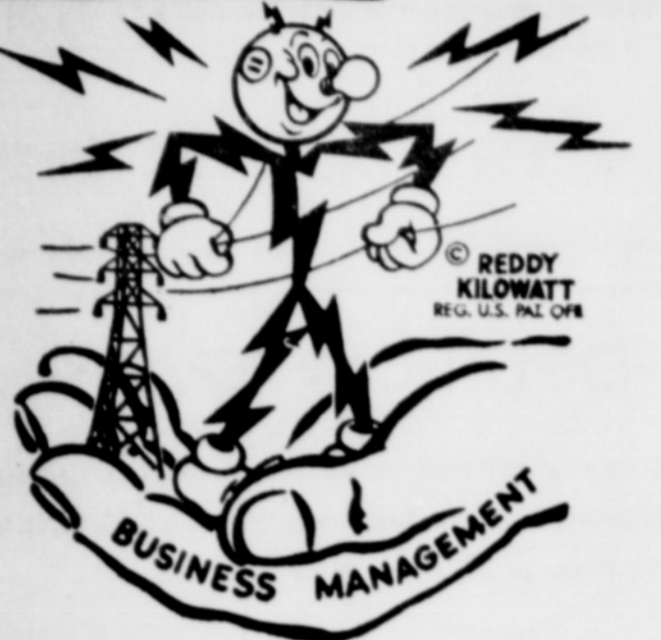

"TOKYO ROSE" COMES HERE TUESDAY ONLY

C.I.O. Claims It Scared 3 Texans Out Of Campaign

Three Texas Congressmen, including the one from this district, have chosen to ignore a statement by the CIO Political Action Committee that they declined to seek reelection as a result of strong CIO antagonism.  
The statement which appeared in CIO-PAC news service clip sheet said: "Three of Texas most relentless labor haters have already been eliminated from the congressional races. Representatives Fritz Lanham, Harlon Summers and Sam Russell declined to seek re-election as a result of strong CIO antagonism."  
Summers and Lanham declined to comment, saying they figured the CIO-PAC hoped they would engage in a controversy.  
Russell decided not to seek reelection because he has found the Washington climate does not agree with him. Russell has been a consistent opponent of new deal measures.
