1906, in Rome, Georgia, the youngest of eight children of Columbus $M$ and Lola Jones Lane. In 1908, she moved with six of her seven sibling to Clarendon, Texas, where she completed high school at Clarendon Col
lege Academy. She attended Clarendon College and graduated Clarendon College and graduate
from the University of Texas at Aus tin. She married Everette H. "Rusty" Clark on August 20, 1928, in Amarillo: He was a geologist, and for sev eral years they traveled the country doodle-bugging.'

In the early 1940 's, she earned an M.S. Degree in Library Science, and she remained in this field until her re tirement. During one phase of he career, she was Law Librarian at the
