A person can have influenza more than once because the virus that causes influenza may belong to different strains of one of
three different flu virus families. A B or the rare type C. Type A viruses tend to have a disproportionate af fect on adults, Type B viruses have a disproportionate affect on children. Both $A$ and $B$ have strains that cause inness of varying
severity. The influenza A family has more strains than the $\mathbf{B}$ family . Flu can be prevented with influenza vaccine. This vaccine is produced each year so that the vac-
cine can contain influenza viruses that are expected to cause illness that year. A yearly influenza vaccination is about 75 percent effec tive in preventing ffu and reducing e severity of the flu,

nually. The ideal time to receive flu
vaccine is between October 15 and November 15 .
