The averase home is usually three to six months. Foster parents are assisted with reimbursements for the child's expenses. Foster parents can choose he age, sex and race of childre hey wish to foster.

Elm Leaf Beetles Attack Trees
$\mathbf{A}_{\text {trees begin to }}^{\mathbf{s} \text { the warms up and }}$ LEY County will soon see the emergence of the Elm Leaf Beetle. Adults are about $1 / 4$ inch long and light yellow to brownish-green.
Several black spots decorate the head and thorax, and a broad black stripe follows the outer margin of
each wing cover. Mature larva are each wing cover. Mature larva are about $1 / 2$ inch long and yellow with $1 / 4$ inch long and bright orange-yel low with scattered black bristles.
Elm leaf beetles overwinter in any sheltered, dry place which
gives them protection. occasional ly, overwintering adults enter ly, overwintering adults enter nuisance on warm days. In the spring beetles fly toelm trees shortly after foliage emerges. they eat
holes in new leaves. and soon holes in new leaves and soon
deposit double rows of 5 to 25 yel lowish eggs, which resemble minute lemons, on the underside of leaves New infestations of young elm leaf beetles are easily over-
looked because of their feeding location. At first, thee green part of the leaves are removed with just the veins remaining. As damage ac cumulates, dry skeltonized leaves trees have sparse forage, and remaining leaves take on a rusty reddish-brown tint. Heavily in fested trees drop leaves prema turely and may eventually die. Natural enemies include birds, toas,
predaceous and parasiticinsects. A small wasp frequently kills many pupae. Chemical control of elm leaf beetles depends on early detection ticidal coverage of the tree. Examine the underside of leaves for yeliow eggs and young larvae in leafs out. Control measures nor
