Pesticide Container Recycling
The Texas pesticide container recycling program has established the spring and summer col-
lection dates for 1994. The recycling program is a cooperative pro gram with the Texas Natural
Resource Conservation Commission, Texas Department of Agriculture and Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

The containers must be clean and totally free of chemicals to be
recycled. Producers are doing a better job of triple or pressure rinsing empty containers. The 1993 rejection rate for contaminated containers was $19 \%$ for plastic and tainer rejection rate for 1993 was approximately $35 \%$ lower than the 1992 rate. The container clean-up procedure works best if completed following immediate use of the pes-
ticide. Old containers are difficult to clean if residue are allowed to dry into a sticky scum.

The Texas Pesticide Container program is now ranked thir behind Mississippi and California in recycling empty containers.
State-wide, Texas recycled 220,000 pounds of containers in 1993. This amount can be increased as producers are urged to recycle instead of burning or disposal in
