The School Administration office has a copy of the policy, whic The houschold size and income crit o determine the eligibility for free and reduced price benefits. Children rom households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Foster children that are the legal respon-
sibility of a welfare agency or court may also be eligible for benefits sibility of a welfare agency or court may also be eligible for benefits
regardless of the income of the household with whom theyreside. Eligibility for the foster child is based on the child's income.
Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability or free and reduced price meals or their chidren. Applications also are availabie at the principars office fill out the application and return it to the school. Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and verification of data. Applications may be verified by the chool officials at any time during the school year.

For school officials to determine eligibiiity for free and reduced price hild's name, food stamp or AFDC Case number and only have to list their member must sign the application. Households who do not list a food stamp or AFDC case number must list the names of all household members, the amount andssource of the income received by each houschold member, hov primary wage earner responsible for the care of the child on the social ecurity number of the adult household member who signs the application. If neither household member has a social security number, the household, member must indicate that a social security number is not a

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal policy the reviewing official will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling, or the official, may wish to discuss he decision with the reviewing official on an informal, basis. Parents wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a chool Administration Office or phone 856-5323.

Households that list a food stamp or AFDC case number must report when the household no longer received these benefits. Other households approved for benefits based on income information must report increases in houschold income or over $\$ 50$ per month or $\$ 600$ per year and decreases in houschold size. Also, if a houschold member becomes unemployed or i changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if the houschold's income falls at or below the levels shown above.
