## WHAT ANSWERS DOES THE FUTURE HOLD?

(AN EDITORIAL) a hospital district and vote bonds for the purpose building a new hospital can not be answered on a posi-

tive basis until the outcome of the election is known but projected answers are possible.
Many have asked if the hospital will have an open
staff. The bill passed by the Legislature created an staff. The bill passed by the Legislature created an
open staff hospital and gave the power to the hospital open staff hospital and gave the power to the hospita
board to name members of the staff. It is the general resident physician, that is licensed by the state, to the hospital staff, regardless of affiliation. The fact that
you, as a taxpayer, have the same choice as anyone else can not be ignored by the hospital board. The hospital board will have the power to name
a person as administrator of the hospital. A facility the size of that proposed for Donley County, will re-
quire the full time services of a person qualified to quire the full time services of a person qualified to
handle the job. It would be unreasonable to assume that it could be managed on a part time basis. It will
be up to the hospital board to locate and hire a person trained in this field of work.
Would you want to live in a community without Would you want to live in a community without
schools or churches? The same question applies to hos-
pital and medical facilities. It costs money to have either. It costs money to progress and be able to enjoy
or receive the things we want or need. or receive the things we want or need.
In this case, as most of us agree, a modern hospita facility is needed. This point can be accomplished by voting for the two propositions March 14. With the pas
sage of this issue it will take time for planning and construction. Should the issue fail, it would mean wait ing another 12 months before another election could be held, and another period of time for planning and
construction. During this time, without medicare patients and revenue from the same, chances would be that the present facility could not continue operation
Laying all differences aside, it would be a de plorable situation for a community to allow such a thing to happen here where we hope to continue living and
rearing our families. The determination as to staff, management, and othe details in question remain with you, the VOTER. Afte the facility is made available it will be up to YOU to
talk with, write letters, or if necessary to petition the talk with, write letters, or if necessary to petition the
Hospital Board or even go so far as to petition the Commissioners Court to see that the hospital is operate
in the interests of the people who support it through in the interests of the people who support it through
