

Smith, Donley County Health Officer, in cooperation with the Texas Department of Health and county school ad-

There will be a Follow Up day January 19th to give a second vaccination to the nearly four hundred persons who may wish to come in for a vaccination. Dr. Smith stated that it is very important to receive a second vaccination four to six weeks after the first one for complete immunization. The second Clinic will be exactly five weeks from the time of the first one.


