CHS Cagers Played Two Holiday Games

Clarendon High School Basketball teams played two games since the printing of the Christmas edition of the Leader. Tuesday night, December 22, the two Varsity teams traveled to Spearman. The boys lost their game 42-51 in a close game all the way. At the end of the first period of play Clarendon led 14-12 and at halftime 22-19. In the third period they trailed 33-34. High for Clarendon was Wayne Carter with 18 points. Ronnie Hill counted for 10. High for Spearman was Ronnie Luzby with 19 points.

Tuesday night, December 29, the boys went to Adrian. The Bronchoes ended the first period of play 11-6. They gained to a lead of 28-18 by halftime and stretched the count to 37-29 in the third quarter. The final score was 55-39. High man for Clarendon was Kenny Bacon with 28 points. Wayne Carter dropped in 13. Adrian's high man was Joel Brownlee with 11.

Clarendon girls lost to Spearman by a score of 31-108. They were unable to contain Shield-knight who accounted for 32 points for Spearman. By quarters the count was 4-27, 18-60, and 24-85. Lee Ann McCracken was tops for Clarendon with 11. She was followed by Joan Smith with 10.

At Adrian the girls got off to a slow start with Clarendon trailing 10-17 by the end of the first quarter. A rally began and the halftime ended with Clarendon 21-Adrian 23. The third quarter showed a tally of 43-27 and the game ended Clarendon 62-Adrian 47. Lee Ann McCracken was high with 35. Joan Smith hit 16 and Joyce Louis 9. High for Adrian was Patty Zaring with 29.

Couch Carl Irlbeck will have both the Varsity boys and girls playing in the Claude Tournament beginning Thursday of this week. The girls will play Vega at 3:30 p.m. and the boys will also play Vega at 5:30 p.m. On Clarendon's side of the bracket are Groom and Claude. If Clarendon teams win their games, they will play Friday night at 7 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. and Saturday night at the same time. If they should lose a game, play will be determined by wins and losses.

Tuesday night the same two teams will go to Phillips. Play will begin there at 6:15. They will enter District play Friday night, January 8, when they will play Memphis at Memphis.

There have been tornadoes, bond issues, elections of all types to take place during 1970 but the weather takes the top spot as far as most residents of this area are concerned... as it has been the driest year on record since weather records have been kept here. The first year to be recorded was 1904.

Unless there is a big change between now and midnight tonight, our moisture total for 1970 will go on record at 8.08 inches for the year. The next amount on record since 1904 was 12.62 in 1927.

The old records show one big, bright outlook though. Each year following an exceptional dry year was a wet one. The total for 1928 following the dry year was 28.77. Another example was 1910 with 12.87 inches and the next year the total was 30.11.

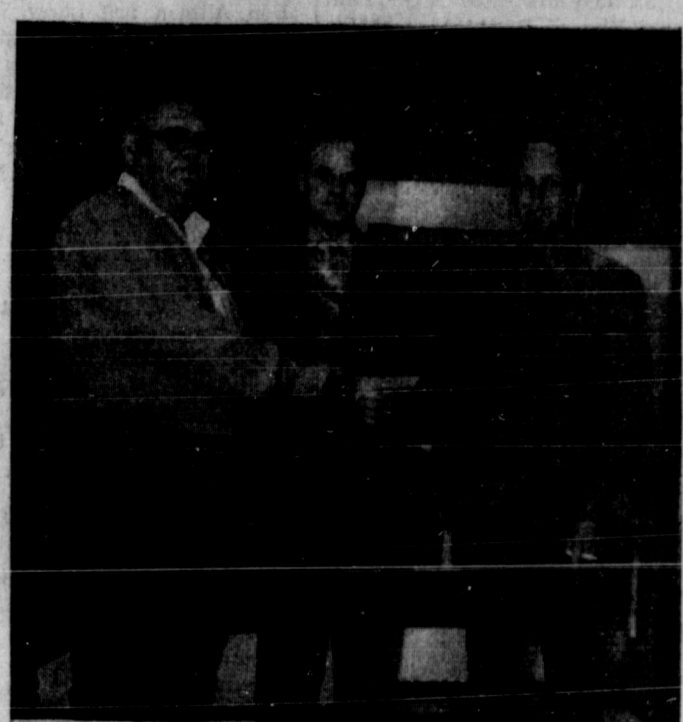

1100 Vaccinated For Diphtheria

According to Maurice Riskey, County School Supt., eleven hundred school children, pre-schoolers, and adults were vaccinated on December 18th in a free Diphtheria Clinic in Clarendon held under the direction of Dr. George W. Smith, Donley County Health Officer, in cooperation with the Texas Department of Health and county school administrators.

There will be a Follow Up Clinic on the afternoon of Friday January 19th to give a second vaccination to the nearly four hundred persons who may wish to come in for a vaccination. Dr. Smith stated that it is very important to receive a second vaccination four to six weeks after the first one for complete immunization. The second Clinic will be exactly five weeks from the time of the first one.

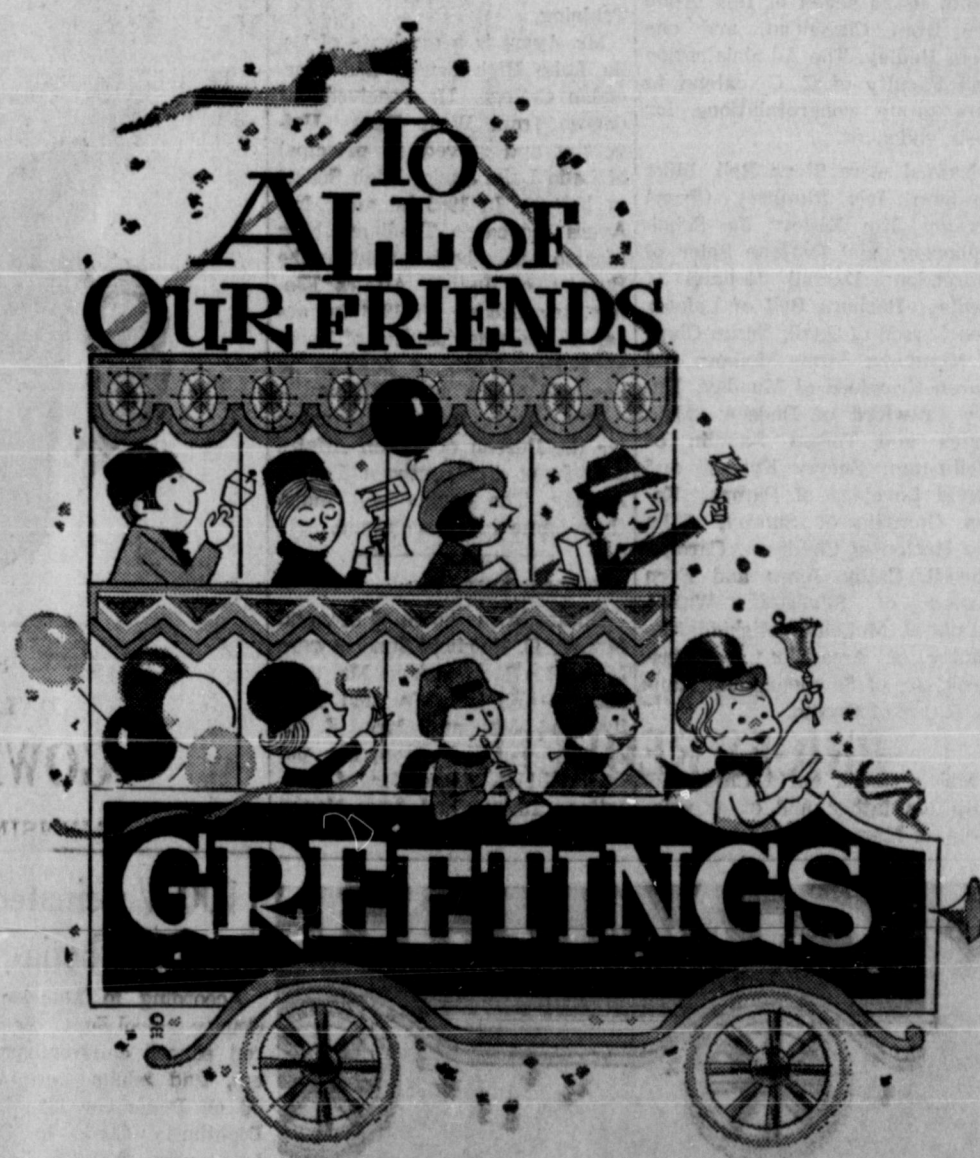

ACP
All practices for which you have approvals must be completed and reported by December 31, 1970. On plowing practices, if you have not completed the work, report what you have done. Reporting a practice as substantially complete applies to permanent practices only.

1971 Wheat Yields
Those of you who have a wheat allotment and harvested wheat acreage for the three base years have received letters informing

you of the opportunity to prove your wheat yield. Remember, you have until January 7, 1971, to file your request for a proven yield.

Cotton Yields
Bring your cotton production records to the office as soon as harvest is complete. No yields can be computed until the records are brought in.

1971 Farm Program
For 1971, substitution between feed grain and wheat will be permitted. This will protect the history for the underplanted crop. Wheat or feed grains planted to substitute for cotton will protect the history; however, the producer would not be eligible for a cotton payment if cotton is not planted. Planting is not re-

quired for feed grain and wheat in order to receive payment. For substitution to be effective, the farm must be signed up in all programs for which he has a base or allotment.

Transfer by Sale or Lease
Producers will have until May 3 to file application for transferring cotton allotments. For 1971, receiving farms must have a base allotment before cotton can be transferred to a farm.

The County ASC Committee and the County ASCS office will make every effort to see that farmers and all other interested persons are fully informed about provisions of the new farm programs through newsletters, and meetings. Please feel free to come to the ASCS office if you have questions on the new program. This office will be closed New Year's Day.

From Your

State Capitol

AUSTIN, Tex. — Frantic preparations are underway to ready the State Capitol for the 62nd legislative session which begins January 12.

Construction workmen still have to complete renovation of the building and completion of new offices and committee rooms. Staffs must be hired and assigned, opening sessions planned and the budget and other major bills drafted.

Surveys indicate that most legislators are agreed that taxing and redistricting of congressional and legislative boundaries are their toughest tasks. But there is no shortage of tough tasks for the lawmakers in 1971.

Legislative Budget Board has pushed the estimated new revenue need to \$645.1 million, and many think it will run a great deal higher, perhaps as much as \$800 million or more. Very few ideas have been offered on how to raise the new revenue.

Political futures of many legislators ride on the redrawing of their district boundaries, which must follow population patterns of the 1970 census.

Among other major problems pinpointed by legislators are: A multi-billion-dollar state budget.

Liquor-by-the-drink legislation. Welfare programs, including an increase in the \$80 million a year ceiling on categorical assistance payments.

Laws to curb drug use and prevent crime.

Revision of auto insurance regulations.

Air and water pollution control. Financing higher education, including a proposed tuition hike.

APPOINTMENTS — Governor Smith appointed District Judge Wendell A. Odom of Houston to the Court of Criminal Appeals. Judge Odom will take the seat of Judge John F. Onion Jr. who was elected presiding judge of the court and assumes the top post on January 1.

Smith named Gerald T. Bissett of Victoria, as Associate Justice of the 13th Court of Civil Appeals. He succeeds Judge Paul

Nye who moves up to Chief Justice on January 1.

To fill Judge Odom's 176th district court bench, Smith appointed Judge William M. Hatten of Houston, now judge of the court of Domestic Relations No. 2.

Andrew L. Jefferson of Houston will succeed Judge Hatten.

AG OPINIONS — County commissioners court should order proceeds from the sale of county hospital bonds deposited with the county treasurer pending completion of proposed construction or improvements, Atty. Gen. Crawford Martin has held.

In other recent opinions, Martin concluded that:

Odesa College cannot lawfully contract with a vending machine company where a member of its board of regents is president and a stockholder.

State Welfare Department has authority to purchase fidelity bonds but not insurance against loss by theft of food stamps and cash.

Maximum fee schedule authorized for Texas Private Employment Agency Regulatory Board does not apply to those charged by an employment agency to employers, but only to those charged employees seeking work.

COURTS SPEAK — A three-judge federal court in Dallas held that Texas' political filing fees are unconstitutional, although low, "reasonable" fees may be permitted. Governor Smith said the ruling would lead to "tremendously chaotic conditions."

Attorney General Martin applauded the decision of the U. S. Supreme Court that voting in national elections must be extended to 18-year-olds but that Congress cannot direct states to permit the teenagers to vote in state and local elections.

RATE HIKE UPCOMING — Auto owners will be getting notice this week of the new insurance rates which they will be paying after January 1.

News won't be so bad as first anticipated. While an average statewide increase of 23.4 per cent had been recommended by the State Insurance Board staff, it now appears that the jump will be between 12 and 18.6 per cent.

Board calculations indicate companies will get an after-tax rate of return of six or seven per cent of total assets. Companies wanted an increase of 27.7 per cent, and are not expected to be overjoyed with the "compromise."

ISLAND ROW-ROARS ON — One of the hottest continuing controversies in the state is over the proposed \$4.1 million purchase of land on Mustang Island for Park purposes.

Governor Smith pledges to do all in his power to prevent the buy with state money, and proposes private fund contributions for the purpose.

Parks and Wildlife Commissioners Harry Jersig of San Antonio and L. P. Gilvin of Amarillo bypassed the Governor and PWC Chairman Pearce Johnson of Austin in asking the release of \$2.1 million of federal funds to buy the land. Over \$2.1 mil-

lion would come from the state bond fund. Bureau of Outdoor Recreation said it would allow use of federal money.

Smith said other areas need parks more.
