Money to finance this office comes from tax money collected from each Texas
County rather than tax County rather than tax
money collected only from Donley County. Money to
finance the superintendent's finance the superintendent's
office is taken from the money paid to school system
by the state for each child by the state for each child
they have enrolled in their schools the past year. The amount of money taken out, however, is paid back to
the individual schools by he individual schools by
aking money from a school fund designated for main tenance and operations of all state schools. This fund is
derived from tax money collected from every county
in Texas. If the office did not in Texas. If the office did not
exist. Donley County schools would not receive more
school funds from the state. school funds from the state.
There would be more money
left in the state-wide maintenance and operation
school fund, however. A base salary for the
County School SuperintenCounty schoo Superinten
dent is set Texas laws.

This yearly salary can be
increased by a vote of County
Trustees As an example, base pay
