

### COLLECT SOIL SAMPLES NOW

COLLEGE STATION - You can get prompt service on samples submitted to the soil testing laboratory during December. C. D. Welch, Extension Soil Chemist at Texas A&M, who is in charge of the laboratory, says that right now they are processing the samples and getting the returns to the producer within a week. They hope to maintain this prompt service through January, Welch says, but generally the requests for soil tests increase after Christmas and there is often a delay in getting a reply.




