bacteria to dotheir job and do it well. If the bacteria are interrupted for some reason they stop the break down process. If this occurs the solid
waste that is delivered to the plant waste that is delivered to the plant
begins to stack-up and causes a very serious problem.
The most common reason that the bacteria die is do to foreign substances being put into the wastewater
collection system. These foreign substances kill the bacteria thereby backing up the plant and this ends up costing the City hundreds and sometimes thousands of dollars as well nany unplanned for man hours.
The substances most often into the collection system that does
damage to the wastewater plant are petroleum products such as diesel, gasoline, and kerosene. Another
foreign substance that is very harm foreign substance that is very harm-
ful is salt. These are often used to kill If you are putting these substances
into into the collection system at this time please stop. These actions are costchemicals and bacterial agents.
Please note: It is also illegal to such substances in the collection sys-
tem. tem. City is required to submit bacteriological samples to the Texas
Water Commission in Austin,Tx. and is also inspected two to three
