Sponsored by Mike's Gibson Pharmacy and Bivens Pharmacy and assisted by volunteers and friends of the Donley Unit of the American Cancer Society a Colorectal Cancer Screening will be held June 11 and 12 from 9 a.m. 6 p.m. at the two pharmacys. Kits for the testing are available for a minimal cost of $\$ 1.50$ and instructions will be given by the volunteers working at each pharmacy.

Results which need the attention of medical personal will be mailed to your family doctor who in turn will contact the person tested if farther attention is wartanted.

This screening is particularly stressed for persons over forty years of age.

More than. 100,000 Americans develop colorectal cancer each year. Both males and females 40 years of age and older have increased chances of developing cancer of the colon or rectum. However, this disease can be successfully treated if it is diagnosed early

This do-it yourself test helps find hidden blood in the stool. Here's how the simple at-home procedure works...follow the diet advised to make the test work best...prepare a stool specimen on three consecutive days using special slides...then send the slides back to your dactor or lab for checking. If results are positive, you'll hear directly from your doctor or clinic. The cause isn't usually cancer. Other intestinal conditions can cause bleeding, but you'llbe checked thoroughly. If it is cancer, finding it at an early stage almost guarantees cure.
