bscribers and readers TEXAS PARKS AND WILD-5 magazine are alerted to a law requiring that all pats MUST have rear view

This fact was contradicted in the June issue of the magazine in an article "Legalize Your Boat." It stated that ___ all motorboats towing persons on skis.... are required to carry an observer or to be equipped with a rear view mirror.

The Parks and Wildlife Department reminds readers of the monthly magazine that, in fact, no such prerogative exists under the Texas Water Safety Code. The law states the following:

"Every motorboat towing a person or persons on water skis, aquaplane or similar device shall be equipped with a rear view mirror of a size no less than four inches (4")in measurement from bottom to top or across from one side to the other. Such mirror shall be mounted firmly so as to give the boat operator a full and complete view beyond the
