The Artists Studio spent many hours arrainging the paintings into their various catagories to be judged. They did a superb job and everyone enjoyed a fine show



Scott, a second-team allstate selection, averaged 24 points and 16 rebounds per game last season.



#### **SWIMMER'S EAR**

Otitis externa is the medical name for what is often referred to as swimmer's ear. In this condition, the ear canal becomes infected and inflammed. The ear canal may itch and a yellow fluid may drain from the ear...this may be visible on pillows upon awakening. Pain is usually experienced when the ear is gently pulled upward and outward.

Is swimming the sole cause of this problem? No. Both swimmers and nonswimmers may be afflicted. Allergy has been implicated in helping to produce infection.






