The Veterans Administration, the agency that serves millions of
consumers daily, will observe National Consumers' Week, April

Check Alfalfa for weevils

This is a cuitical time for alfalfa tions Ronald Gooch, Donley County tension agent. This is the time when producers need to examine their alfalfa for the presence of alfalfa weevil larvae,
Gooch said. With the beginning of warm spring
weather, overwintering female weather, overwintering female
weevils begin laying eggs. The weevils begin laying eggs. The
young larvae which hatch young larvae which hatch out are
very small, yellow-green in color and feed in the growing tips and developing buds. Older larvae are green with a white stripe down their back. alfalfa weevil activity in late April or early May in our area," said Gooch. If larvae numbers are high enought to reach the economic threshold, one
properly timed application should properly timed application should

applied in alfalfa 2 to 6 inches tall
when when two or more larvae are found
