TEAMS tests cover the basic skills of students in grades $1,3,5,7,9$ and 11 , and the 11th grade test serving as an pass in order to receive a diploma. the 1988-89 school year calls for the exit-level exam (which consists of two parts, English language arts and Oct. 25 and 26 and again on May 2 and to pass the exam, beginning in their junior year. The exam for grades 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be administered between Feb 6 and 17, while the first grade exams will be given between April 3 and 14. School districts can choose any days between those daies to give the examinations.
