## The First <br> Thanksgiving Proclamation of the United States-1789

Issued by President Washington
Whereas, it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and

Whereas, both Houses of Congress have, by their joint committee, requested me "to recommend to the people of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness;"

Now, therefore, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of November next to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our service and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country previous to their becoming a ration; for the signal and manifold mercies and the favorable interpositions of His providence in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great degree of tranquility, union and plenty which we have since enjoyed; for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted; for the civil

so well last summer, said Ronald Gooch, county agent with the Texas Geral Extension Service. Gooch said that applying a copper fungicide now can stop or
reduce three of the diseases that attack peach and plum trees in texas. These are peach leaf curl, bacterial
canker.

He advises spraying when 70 percent of the leaves fall off the tree. Spraying too early will cause
leaf shed or cause the spray to be ineffective later on.

Bacterial leaf spot and terial canker can be partially conterialled by fall spraying with a con-
trop per fungicide, but NOT fungicides containing chlorothalonil, Gooch spray. But again, it's important to right time to prevent foliar burn with the copper fungicide. Bacterial leaf spot affects both fruit and foliage. The infection
causes fruit to crack and leaves develop angular spots which drop out. Bacterial canker will kill trees slowly. Infected trees will have gum or wax forming on the main trunk A fall spray.
