Girl Scout Cookies Go On Sale

Quivira Girl Scout Council launched the 1993 Girl Scout cookie sale on January 9th. This year, customers will find the cookies wrapped in brand new boxes designed to communicate the values found in contemporary Girl Scouting.

Through close-up portraits of girls engaged in a variety of Girl Scout activities, the boxes depict the supportive, "girls only" environment in which girls practice new skills, establish lasting friendships, learn from positive female role models and have fun. National studies have shown that a single-sex setting helps girls develop the self-esteem and confidence needed to grow into resourceful, happy citizens.

Each box features a message from a girl, sharing her views on a Girl Scout experience. One girl's message about aerobic exercise experience says, "our Girl Scout leader must be double jointed. She can bend in every direction. Okay, so maybe I can't wrap my leg around my neck, but I'm having a great time anyway!"

The boxes were designed by acclaimed graphic designer Saul Bass, of Bass/Yager & Associates, Los Angeles, California. The award-winning Bass, whose design included logos for such major corporations as AT&T, Exxon, and United Airlines, also created the Girl Scout service mark in 1978.

Cookie-selling is a voluntary activity involving approximately 1,000,000 girls and 400,000 adult volunteers across the country. The girls who participate develop responsibility, learn how to handle money, and to follow through on a promise to deliver a product. This experience is important to girls and help them develop self-confidence that will stay with them throughout their lives.

Proceeds from this year's sale will be used to provide program activities for the members of Quivira Council, training for the volunteers supporting Quivira Council, every troop with funds for a well rounded troop program.

Girls from quivira Girl Scout Council will be taking orders for cookies January 9-23, 1993. Customers who have not been contacted by a Girl Scout can call the council offices 800-439-4475 or 669-6862.

Building Burglarized

Between October 30 and December 31, someone broke into the building on Sully Street where the Frank Phelan family was storing furniture and antiques. The thieves carried off a number of items. Some were sold in Amarillo. Authorities estimate the value of the stolen goods at between \$20,000 and \$30,000.

Donley County Sheriff's officers have arrested a suspect in the

case and are holding him in jail. Bond has been set at \$25,000 on each of two charges.

Officers have recovered some of the stolen goods, and are looking for more.

The suspect has also been charged with tampering with government documents in connection with the alleged theft of blank birth and death certificates.

Motorists Injured

Three attractive young women were seriously injured Monday when they lost control of their vehicle near Hedley. The road was icy. At least two were ejected and suffered serious lacerations of their faces and arms. They were not wearing seat belts. Donley County emergency personnel transported the injured to the hospital.

Two car loads of Dallas-area college students were returning from a New Mexico skiing trip when the accident occurred.

Sergeant Gribble of the Department of Public Safety has urged area motorists to use extra caution this winter. "Give yourself plenty of time. Don't take unnecessary chances." Often a trip can be postponed for 24 hours. That can make the difference between driving on ice or driving on dry highways.

Gribble advises motorists to wear seat belts. "Take some precautions. Keep some extra coats and blankets in the car. If you have a mishap, let the emergency vehicles come to you. Do not try to walk out for help."

The general consensus in area seems to agree that local folks were fortunate. The bad conditions and careless drivers could have resulted in several more tragic accidents. Most of the cars, pickups and trucks on the road moved slowly and cautiously. But a few fools drove like conditions were normal. Such driver not only endanger themselves, but everyone else on the road.

Arizona Likes Judging Team

The Clarendon College Livestock judging team started the new year off on a good note as the nabbed top honors at the Arizona National Livestock judging contest held New Year's Day in Phoenix. Clarendon finished ahead of Kansas entry Allen County and Oklahoma entries Connors State and Northeastern Oklahoma (NEO). The Clarendon team composed of Jo Bonney LeCompte, Tucumcari, New Mexico; Shannon McLain, Gill, Colorado; Shawn Jeter, Artesia, New Mexico; Johnny Treichel, Waller; and Ed Tice, White Deer outdistanced 12 junior college teams to bring home the championship. Clarendon was named high reasons team and garnered first in the swine judging competition. They also finished third in beef and fourth in the sheep.

McLain and LeCompte paced the team as they finished second and fourth in the individual competition, respectively. Other individual awards included: LeCompte first-reason and third-cattle division; and McLain first and Jeter second-swine division.

Clara Lohoefer Remembers

For a number of years, when you called the First Bank and Trust, there was a good chance that the cheerful voice that answered the telephone would belong to Clara Lohoefer. But last Friday, The First Bank and Trust honored Mrs. Lohoefer with a reception. She has decided to retire.

Mrs. Lohoefer started at the bank in 1955, working first as a book-keeper. She was promoted in 1958, and in 1962 she stepped up to a teller's window. About 1977 she was named Assistant Vice President.

When Mrs. Lohoefer started work at the bank, it had capital of about \$3 million. When she retired, the figure was \$39 million.

In those many years, she saw plenty of changes in Clarendon and in the banking business. "Perhaps the biggest change was going on computer," she said. "Now the computers even type out the notes. Its amazing."

One of Mrs. Lohoefer's first associates in the banking business was Walter Taylor, a humorous man who was born in old Clarendon. "He was probably born about 1875," she recalled. Taylor had a way of making life funny. On one occasion a customer kept waiting and waiting after Taylor had waited on him. Finally, Taylor asked, "Is there something else I can do for you?" The customer replied, "Well, could I have my cigar back?" Mr. Taylor had inadvertently picked up the customer's stogy.

One of the funniest things that happened to Mrs. Lohoefer was coming to work only to find that her employer had moved across the street! During the night, the First National Bank had sold out. But she went ahead working with the new bank.

It was clear at the reception that her colleagues would miss Mrs. Lohoefer. And over a 38 year period, a person can make friends of lots of customers. Mrs. Lohoefer expects to have an active retirement. She obviously has many well-wishers.

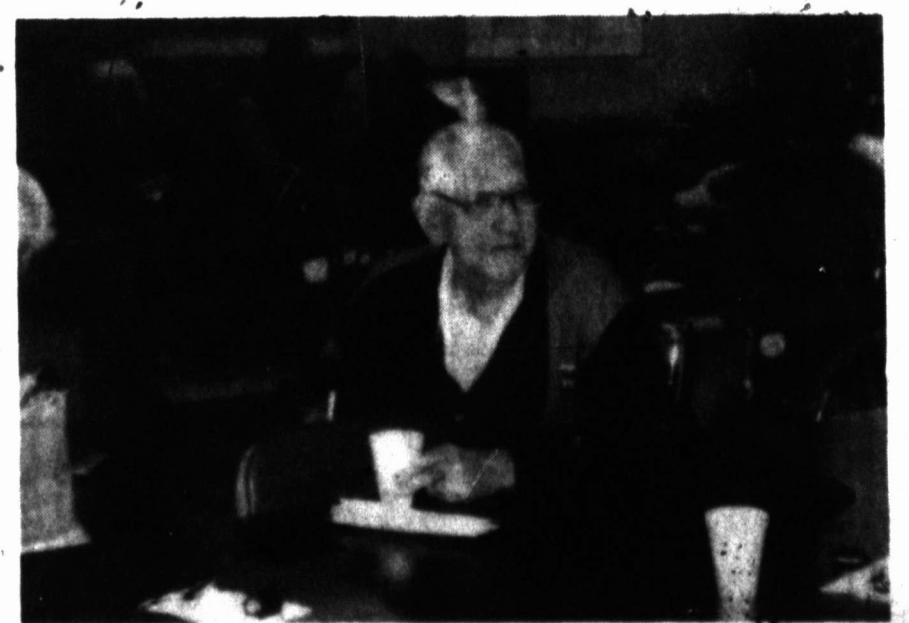
One hundred fifty-eight West Texas State University undergraduates were named to the President's List and 678 earned mention on the Deans' List for the

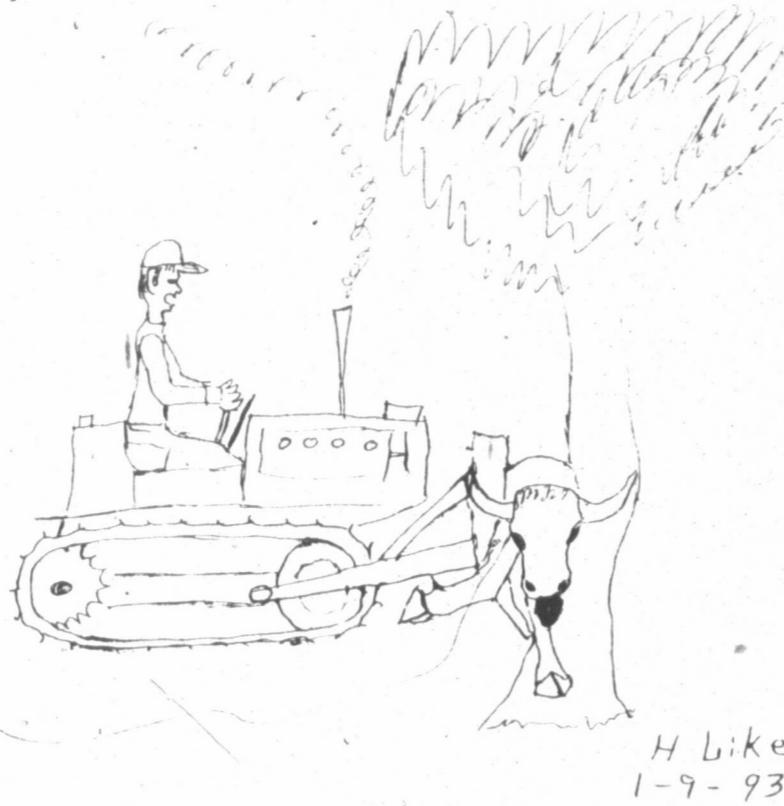


PUD BAIN (right) and other residents enjoying the New Year's Eve Party at the Medical Center

Establishing Windbreaks

A successful windbreak planting depends on proper establishment and care during the first few years after planting. Take no shortcuts in the planning of your windbreak.

One species of evergreen that is good for a windbreak is the Rocky Mountain Juniper. (Juniperus scopulorum). Other common names for this tree is: Rocky Mountain Redcedar, River juniper and Cedro rojo.

Rocky Mountain juniper is one of twelve junipers native to the U.S. It is sometimes confused with Eastern redcedar but is actually a separate species. This tree may reach heights of 35'. The foliage is needle-like and has a waxy bloom which gives it its blue-grey color. The flowers appear in the spring and the male and female flowers appear on separate trees. The Rocky Mountain Juniper is a very tough, durable tree and can tolerate low moisture conditions. Another advantage of this tree is that the fruit is eaten by a variety of birds, including turkey.

INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS MAY EASE BURDEN OF PAYING TAXES

A recent addition to the tax code allows for installment payments of certain homestead taxes. The individual must be at least 65 years of age and be paying taxes on property that the person owns and occupies as a residence homestead. The taxes are to be paid in four equal installments, the first being due before February 1. The other payments are due before April 1, before June 1 and before August 1.

Another recent change in tax law pertains to making escrow payments in order to pay taxes in advance. For example, a taxpayer may enter into a payment contract this month and make nine equal monthly payments toward the 1993 taxes. The advantage in using this method is that the taxes are paid by the time the statement is mailed in October.

Social Security News

Social Security Recipients Must Report Earnings

By Jim Talbot

If you worked and received Social Security benefits in 1992, you have until April 15th to report your earnings to Social Security if you earned over the annual limits. The 1992 earnings limits were \$7,440 for beneficiaries under age 65 and \$10,200 for beneficiaries age 65-69. The earnings limits do not apply to people who are age 70 and over the entire year.

The purpose of the annual earnings report is to enable us to compare your actual earnings with

the estimate you provide when you applied for benefits or when you filled last year's earnings report. The benefits you were paid in 1992 were based on that estimate. If you earned less than you estimated, you may be due additional money. If you made more than you estimated for 1992, you may have to repay some benefits.

The report should also include an estimate of the earnings you expect to make in 1993. Note that the earnings limits for 1993 are \$7,680 for beneficiaries under age 65 and \$10,560 for beneficiaries age 65-69. Again, you benefit check will be adjusted to reflect any excess earnings anticipated.
