State Rules Against CISD

After a hearing on March 2, 1993, the Texas Education Agency entered a proposed decision that states, "Petitioner [Aleta] Thompson's appeal is granted."

The TEA document states that, "Petitioner Thompson satisfied her burden of proof in establishing a violation of 19 T.A.C. §149.43(c)(3) and local policy DQC. ... Neither Mr. Kepley nor Respondent district properly executed local policy." The agency further stated that: "Mr. Kepley's observation record of Petitioner Thompson during the spring of 1992 is not to be considered in the final calculation of Petitioner Thompson's summative evaluation."

Mr. Kepley had no comment on the agency's findings. As of press time, Superintendent Jeff Walker had not AIRMAN SHARI COLLINS returned the newspaper's phone calls. Board President Todd Knorpp said that he had not been informed of the hearing or the decision, therefore, of course, he had no comment.

The dispute goes back to Mr. Kepley's evaluation of Mrs. Thompson in the Spring of the 1991-1992 school year. In the Fall of that year both Mr. Kepley and an independent appraiser gave Mrs. Thompson a high evaluation.

Mrs. Thompson requested a re-evaluation. That third evaluation was never made.

Mrs. Thompson appealed to the Board of Trustees on August 13. Four board members voted to deny that Mrs. Thompson had a grievance. One Trustee voted for the teacher, and one abstained because he was related to the teacher's husband.

Apparently, had the Principal or the board agreed to a third evaluation, the matter would have ended at that point. The TEA document states that, "Petitioner Thompson was entitled to an observation by a third appraiser and was denied such by respondent. Accordingly, her appeal is to be granted and her 1991-92 summative evaluation score is to exclude the appraisal score provided by Mr. Kepley for the Spring of 1992."

The hearings officer noted that, "On a handwritten memo allegedly written to document his meeting with Mr. and Mrs. Thompson, Mr. Kepley scratched out the date of 5/19/92 and wrote 5/15/92. The date of 5/14/92 was set as the date for summative conferences with all the faculty.'

The report continued, "There is no explanation provided by the Respondent for Mr. Kepley's original notation of 5/19/92, ... there is nothing to explain the error of 4 days in noting the date." It then states, "Mr. Kepley displayed a less than candid demeanor and willingness to directly answer questions during his testimony at the hearing." The Discussion section of the report concluded with the observation, "His demeanor and willingness to directly answer a question were less than candid at this point in time. Given these contradictions and less than straightforward demeanor, Mr. Kepley's credibility is severely eroded."

The school board extended Mr. Kepley's contract and awarded him a \$2,500 raise on February 11, at their last regular meeting, by a vote of five ') one.

There are many reasons a child may not grow as fast as he or she should. Some are temporary and merely variations of normal growth patterns. Others are inherited or associated with other physical problems-for example, a bone disease called chondrodystrophy; Turner Syndrome, a genetic disorder in some girls; or nutritional deficiencies. Short stature could even be the first sign of a serious medical condition such as disease of the kidney, heart or lungs.

A rule of thumb for parents who suspect a growth problem in their child is that any child who grows less than two inches a year after his or her second birthday should be examined by a pediatric endocrinologist (or other growth specialist). Other questions to ask yourself include:

· Is your child still wearing last year's clothes?

· Is your child unable to keep up at play with other children the same age

Animals, like people, are most susceptible to infectious agents during the first months of life. Newborn animals usually receive protection from antibodies in their mother's milk. To be sure kittens and puppies get this protection, the mother should be immunized before breeding. To maintain and strengthen disease resistance after the antibodies in the mother's milk have been depleted, a series of vaccinations should be administered to young animals from approximately six weeks to six months. Lifetime protection is maintained by annual "booster" vaccinations. There are many effective vaccination schedules and your pet is never too old to start. Vaccines are administered under the skin, in the muscle or by nasal spray.

BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS SPECIAL ELECTION MAY 1, 1993

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT

Section 1 of Senate Joint Resolution 7 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the legislature to redistribute among other school districts ad valorem taxes levied and collected by a school district. The amendment would also allow the legislature to create county education districts with the taxable property of existing school districts in one or more counties combined. County education districts may levy, collect, and distribute ad valorem taxes as authorized by general law. The legislature would be allowed to set the rate of the ad valorem tax to be imposed in a school district or county education district or it may authorize the board of trustees of each school district or county education district to set the rate, provided that the rate of county education district ad valorem taxes may not exceed \$1.00 per \$100 valuation of taxable property, unless a higher rate is approved by the voters of the district. The amendment also provides that the amount of ad valorem taxes redistributedamong school districts by the legislature and effectively redistributed within a county through county education districts may not exceed 2.75 percent of the sum of the state revenue appropriated for public schools and the revenue from local ad valorem taxes levied and collected for public schools. The term "state revenue" does not include revenue from ad valorem taxes, revenue for the provision of free textbooks, or contributions to a retirement system. Finally, the amendment provides that it does not affect the distribution of the available school fund under article VII, section 5, of the Texas

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment allow ing limited redistribution of ad valorem taxes for schools, authorizing the legislature or local districts to set a minimum tax rate in county education districts, and placing a cap on the ad valorem tax levied by county education districts

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT

Section 2 of Senate Joint Resolution 7 proposes' a constitutional amendment that would provide that, except for state educational mandates imposed in compliance with the Texas Constitution or federal law, or unless enacted by a vote of at least two-thirds of the members elected to each house of the legislature, a school district may not be required to treasury in each fiscal year, not otherwise comply with an obligation requiring expenditure of school district funds unless the obligation is fully funded. The amendment also requires the legislature to provide by law a procedure for determining whether an obligation is fully funded. In the absence of such a procedure, and at the request of a school district's board of trustees, the comptroller of public accounts shall determine whether or not an obligation is fully funded. This amendment applies only to state educational mandates enacted after December 31,

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment exempting a school district from the obligation to comply with unfunded state educational mandates.

PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 4 proposes an amendment to article VII, section 5(b), of the constitution, which currently authorizes the legislature to provide for using the permanent school fund to guarantee bonds issued by school districts and certain education-related revenue bonds issued by the state. The amendment would repeal the provision authorizing

the use of the permanent school fund to guarantee state revenue bonds, but would permit the legislature to provide by law for the issuance of general obligation bonds or revenue bonds of the state for the purpose of making loans to, or purchasing bonds of, school districts for the purpose of acquisition, construction, or improvement of instructional facilities, including all furnishings. The amendment also provides that the state, pursuant to general law, may forgive the payment of principal and interest on all or part of a oan made to a school district under the amendment to partially finance an instructional facility. The cap of \$750 million on the amount of bonds that could be issued under article VII, section 5(b), as amended, would be retained. The amendment would repeal the current provision of the constitution permitting the legislature to authorize bonds in excess of \$750 million by two-thirds record vote of both houses of the legislature. While any of the general obligation bonds issued under the amendment or any of the interest on those bonds is outstanding and unpaid, there would be appropriated out of the first money coming into the state appropriated by the constitution, the amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the bonds that matured or became due that fiscal year.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment authorizing the issuance of \$750 million in state general obligation or revenue bonds to assist school districts in partially financing facilities, authorizing the state to forgive payments of loans made to a school district for partially financing facilities, and repealing the authorization for \$750 million in state revenue bonds guaranteed by the permanent school fund:


