Where you live may affect your SSI Payments $\mathrm{O}_{\text {tions I get comes from Sup }}^{\text {ne of the mit }}$ plemental Security Income (SSI) he effect that their living arrange eeffect where they live and with whom they live has on their SS
Payments. It can be complicated keep in mind when you conside how your living arrangements affect your SSI.
As a general rule, if you get SI and receive help in paying for nay be reduced. This is because ligibility for SSI and the amount of your payment is based on the income and resources you have. If someone else is helping to pay for
your food or shelter, the value of heir contribution must be con sidered as part of your income. We also look at such things as whether you are living in your own ome or the home of someone else paying rent in the home of some
else, or living in an institution.

If you are living in your own home, regardless of whether you (or your spouse) own or rent, you'll
generally qualify for the highest SSI generally qualify for the highest SSI payment rate. You may also qualify
for this rate if you are living in the ome of someone else but pay rent and buy your own food. A child living with his or her parents also may get an SSI payHowever, the parent's income and resources and the number of children in the home are conidered in determining SS eligibility and the payment amount
for a child. The instances in which your
iving arrangements may reduce your payment amount included in he following:
ff you are living in the hom paying your share of the househol expenses, Your federal SSI pay nent is generally reduced by a much as one-third.
IIf you are living in a public
astitution where your provided at Taxpayer's expense ( such a State mental hospitals and prisons, you're probably not
eligible for SSI.
A homeless person generally
nay receive the maximum SSI ment rate. That is why we mak special efforts to get SSI informa ion to the homeless, the payments can help them find permanent
