Get To Know Your Cotton Plants

By Tim Trimble
If you're a cotton grower and you're not plant mapping, chances are decisions
 reliable guide to what your cotton needs to produce mort Plant monitoring will help you manage your crop inputs so you get he most lint with the highest quality Ideally, plant mapping should be done weekly. Usually the time required to map a field is 10 to 20 minutes. Even if you don't have time for a complete plant map every weekly, plant mapping will teach the observa-
tion skills needed to read the crop's progress ion skills needed to read the crop's progress.
Each plant stage, from pre-squaring to late bloom, will be mapped on
field by field basis. Focus on early crop stages because you can use the information you gather for immediate production decisions.

It's a good idea to record your plant monitoring on paper for comparison throughout the season. Plant mapping kits to make it easier are available free of charge through our office or from the National Cotton
Council or the Extension Office.

This mapping program bases management decisions on fruit retenbranches. If we lose first position fruit at lower nodes - from the moneymaking positions -- it doesn't matter what's happening at other positions.
