WTU To Furnish City With Electrical Power

BAIRD- New Transformers have been installed in the West end of Baird. The City has been negotiating with West Texas Utilities and have purchased three transformers. The City paid \$8,000.00 for them and the over all cost was \$9,000.00.

These transformers will put the South circuit on WTU. This area is mostly residential but some businesses are on it. Those businesses included are the Waterhole, Hardwick Oil, Rogers Food Store, Hanner Chevrolet and U-U Steakhouse.

The City is paying WTU 2.30 per kw. on demand, .0906 per kw. for energy charge, .0106 per kw. fuel adjustment, plus \$79.00 customer charge.

Baird residents will pay the City, after the \$4.00 minimum charge, .2218 for the first 25 kw., .1478 for the next 25 kw. The first 50 kw. will cost you \$9.25.

On the commercial basis, for the first 50 kw. you will pay .2166, for the next 50 kw. it would be .1690. Therefore, the first, 100 kw. will cost you \$19.28. All kw. over 100 will cost .0740.

The power rate is .1458 for the first 500 kw. and .1202 for the next 500. The cost of 1000 kw. will be \$133.00. The cost over 1000kw. is .0600.

The City is planning to negotiate with WTU to get the entire city hooked up with WTU. These same transformers can be used later when WTU hooks up. They will then be set up by the lightplant.

When WTU does come in to hook up it will take them about eight months to complete it.

The city paid WTU \$4,000.00 to put in its regulators. They have automatic kick out switches on them.

The City plans to maintain the lightplant in case of an emergency when WTU is off.



Grasshoppers **Cause Damage**

COUNTY- A grasshopper infestation in the county is causing considerable damage to home gardens, fruit trees and other crops, according to Greg Gerngross, County Extension Agent.

Numerous small grasshoppers observed over most parts of the county this past week indicate that the population will be more severe in coming weeks.

Two insecticides are labeled for use for grasshopper control are Sevin and Malathion. There is also a Toxaphene bait available for use along the edge of fields. This formulation is intended as a barrier treatment to reduce migration into fields. A formula for mixing this bait is available from the County Extension office.







Deadline For Taxes, July 31

COUNTY- July 31, 1979 is the date by which employers must report on Form 941 Social Security and withheld federal income taxes for the second quarter of 1979, and pay any taxes due, the Internal Revenue Service said. If the quarterly liability (reduced by any deposit during the quarter) is \$200 or more, the unpaid balance must be deposited.

This deadline does not

apply to those employers who make timely deposits of the full amount of tax due in Federal Reserve or approved commercial banks. They are allowed until August 10 to file Form 941, "Employer's Quarterly Federal Tax Return."

If employers have not received Form 941 by mail, they can obtain one from local IRS offices. IRS Publication 15, "Circular E--Employer's Tax Guide," is also available at local offices.

Farmers Can Still File Request

COUNTY- Although July 15 was the deadline to file a request, we need to stress the fact that farmers can go ahead and file a request with their supplier after this date, said Dycus, acting executive director of the Callahan County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service of Baird.

The request should include: name and address; intended end user of volumes of natural gas needed; natural gas purchases for most recent 12 months

for which records are available; documentation to support calculation of needs: standard industrial classification code numbers such as 01 for crops and 02 for livestock; signature swearing or affirming to accuracy of the request; and contacting local natural gas suppliers concerning procedures for obtaining agricultural priority.

If there is an interstate line involved, it could move you from a lower priority to a higher priority.
