Library Receives Award

Announcement has been made that the G.B. Burton Memorial Library in Clarendon is a recipient of the 1992 J. Frank Dobie Award, in the amount of \$6,000.00. At Mr. Dobie's request, announcement of the awards is made at the annual meeting of the Texas Library Association. This year it was held in Houston April 7-11. Application for the award, which is funded by the J.Frank Dobie Library Trust, is open to legally established libraries in Texas which serve a population of 15,000 or less and are open for service at least 20 hours a week.





Arthritis Treatment: The Pyramid Approach

There are two major types of arthritis. Osteoarthritis is a condition in which there is a gradual wearing away of cartilage, the cushioning material at the ends of bones. When cartilage deteriorates, bones tend to rub together. Osteoarthritis occurs with aging as the result of long-term wear and tear on the joints. Rheumatoid arthritis, on the other hand, can occur at any age. It is a swelling and inflammation of the synovium, the thin lining of the joints. The result of both arthritis types is pain, inflammation,

A new approach to the treatment of rheumatoid arthritis is being promoted by some health authorities. The approach, which is referred to as the pyramid approach, is described in a recent issue of Postgraduate Medicine. At the base of the pyramid (first treatment steps) is education, physical therapy, occupational therapy, and high doses of salicylates (such as aspirin).

To these first measures physicians may add anti-inflammatory and antirheumatic medicines, usually in a step-wise fashion. Such medicines include nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory agents, low-dose prednisone, hydroxychloroquine, gold salts, penicillamine, methotrexate, cyclophos phamide, high-dose steroids, and finally, the experimental agents.

Advice for Gardeners

Randy White of White's Feed and Seed has offered some hints for lawns and gardens for

White says, "You may have noticed your shade trees are beginning to bud out. This means that it is a perfect time to fertilize trees and bushes of all types." Fertilome and other manufacturers make products specifically suited to various trees and shrubs. "Fertilizing now will help trees and shrubs replenish foliage that was damaged during this winter's untimely freezes." This is the time to feed roses, too.

Pine tip moths need treatment now if they have made problems in the past. Spray the first week in April, first of June, mid July and early September.

If you have trees that turn yellow in the middle of the summer, the time to fix the problem is now, not after symptoms appear. Maples and other acid-loving plants are particularly susceptible to iron chlorosis. White's recommends lonate at one pound per inch of trunk diameter.

White's has bedding plants in and are really selling them rapidly. Such flowers are really starting to brighten up the town.

Weeds are a big problem in the area this spring. As predicted, the mild winter made ideal conditions for many unwanted sprouts. These weeds can be controlled by several herbicides, many of which come packaged with fertilizer. Just spread the fertilizer/herbicide granules with a spreader like normal lawn feeding. However, it is a good idea to stay back from the dripline of many trees.

Insects probably also benefited from the mild winter. They will probably be a major problem for farmers, gardeners and lawn people. Some troublesome insects may need to be treated now. Others can wait until they are a visible threat. Check with a local nurseryman or the county agent for advice.
