## Low Doses of Aspirin Following Stroke

Numerous reports have occurred in the medical literature in recent years regarding the value of daily doses of aspirin in preventing heart drug's ability to prevent the accumulation and clumping of platelets in the blood.

Studies also show the value of aspirin in the prevention of transient have been reported to produce this protectanteffect.
