Near 70 MPH Winds—High winds early Friday morning ripped this tree from the ground in the Barton yard on Sherry St. Limbs and debris were scattered throughout town.

High Winds & Torrential Rains Hit County Over Week-end

Sixty to seventy mile winds blew into Baird at 2:15 Friday morning causing come damage throughout the area.

Limbs were blown off a tree at Kenneth McPherson's on the west edge of Baird. Trees were ripped from the ground in the yards of Lucille Manion and Francis Barton.

Endgate Hawk of Hawk Portable Buildings reported some damage to three of his storage buildings when one of them was blown over hitting two others causing damage to the siding. He estimated it to be approximately \$100 worth of damage.

Bertie Adams had windows blown out

of her house, and the Weldon Glossons had an air conditioning unit torn from their window from the wind. Trees were reported blown down in the yard of Shirley Austin residents.

Larry Chersire of WTU reported only minor damages for customer service. Most of the damage was caused by falling limbs and trees.

Mrs. R.B. Taylor, correspondent for the Star in Putnam, reported about 6 inches of rain and no reports of wind damage there.

Two inches of rain was measured in Baird while Clyde reported 4 inches.

Commission Impressed With Co Efforts To Remedy Jail Violations

Officials of Callahan County impressed the Texas Commission on Jail Standards with the efforts that have been put into motion to bring the 84 year old jail into compliance with state standards.

In the past years the county has made improvements and worked with the commission. But several problems still remain.

Sheriff's office at this time is in the

process of remedying the problem of having a Jailer 24 hours a day, by hiring additional dispatchers who are qualified.

Additional keys will be made and bids will be open tomorrow for the construction of the 30x20 recreational area to be installed on the West side of the jail.

A letter from the Commission was received by Judge Mack Kniffen's office thanking County officials for their cooperation.

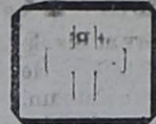

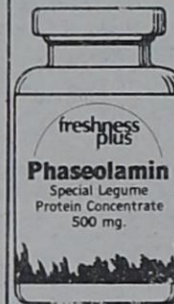

For many weeks in 1971 I and other members of my family spent a 24 hour vigil in the Callahan County Hospital with my mother and again with a brother in 1975. We learned first hand the dedicated service rendered by the personnel of that hospital. There is no place on earth where these family members could have received better care than right here in our own community.

It was with this in mind in September of 1980 that I underwent major surgery

in the Callahan Hospital. Again I found that the service and care was far above the average care in the larger hospital that I had experienced in earlier years. I am still convinced that there is no place where I could have received better care. I am not a medicare patient but when given a choice I would choose Callahan Hospital every time I have need of hospital care.

I'm aware there are problems involving hospital administration just like there are problems with

such things as schools and city halls but we don't shut them down, we work out the problems and keep the facilities that are a benefit to our community.

Our community needs this hospital. Please, let's do whatever we have to do to keep our hospital.

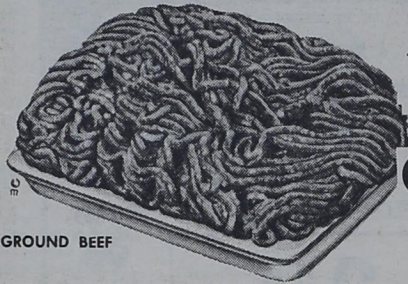

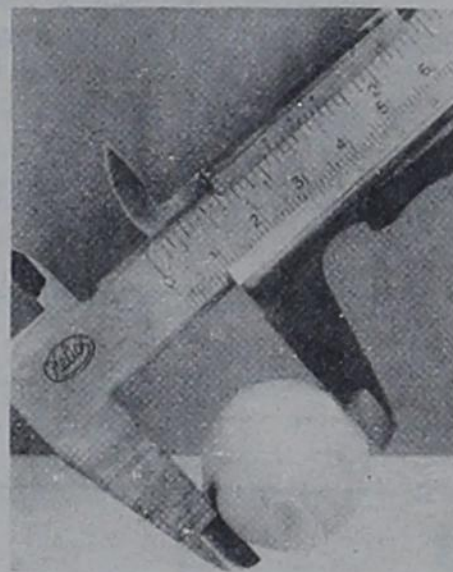

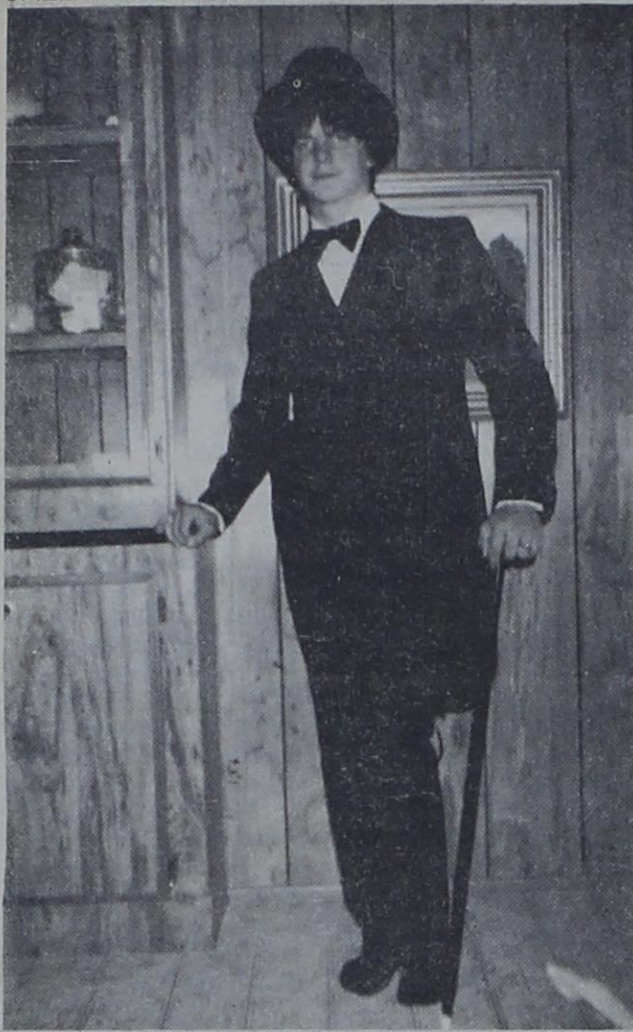
