Havens Named On Honor Roll

Crystal Gail Havens, daughter of Bob and Connie Havens, of Clarendon, has been named on the Midwestern State University Honor Roll. Crystal was one of 471 honor students listed for the fall semester. A student must complete a semester schedule of at least 12 semester hours with a minimum grade point average of 3.5 and no grade lower than a "C" makes the University Honor Roll.

The 12-hour course requirement does not include courses in physical education, developmental courses in English and math, freshman seminar or marching band. In addition, the student cannot have a semester grade of I, WF or NC.

County Judge Honored

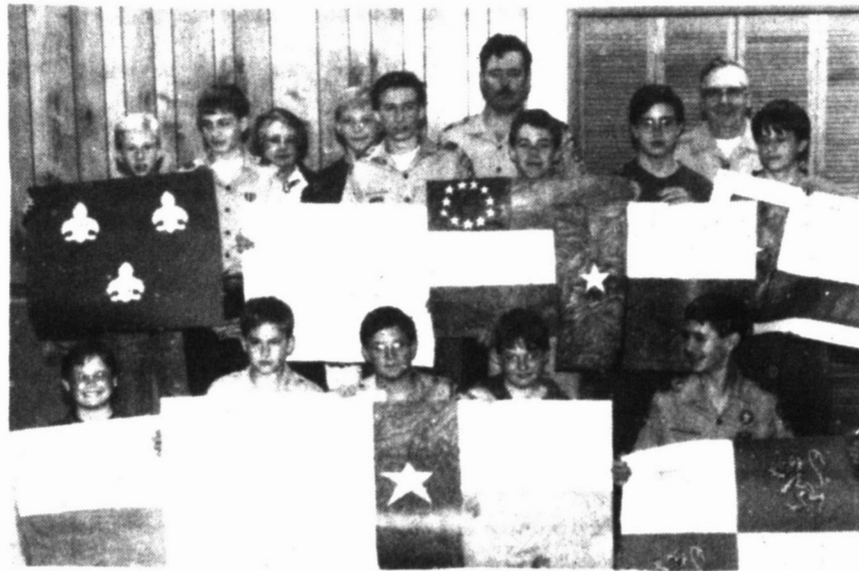

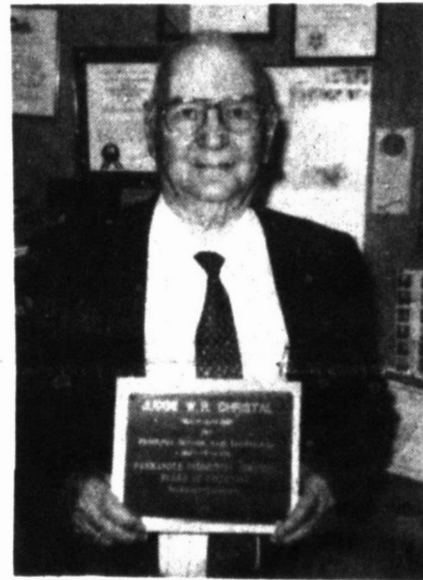

Sheriff Busts Three In Drug Raid

In a surprise raid last week, law enforcement officers in Donley County arrested three males for selling drugs.

Officers from the Donley County Sheriff's Department, The Texas Department of Public Safety and The Texas Parks and Wildlife Service raided a residence on the north side of Clarendon shortly after 10:00 Tuesday night, February 4. They were assisted by officials from the District Attorney's office and others.

The officers arrested two of the accused sellers at the house, and captured a third suspect in a nearby street. Two of the men are Donley County residents; one is from Wichita Falls.

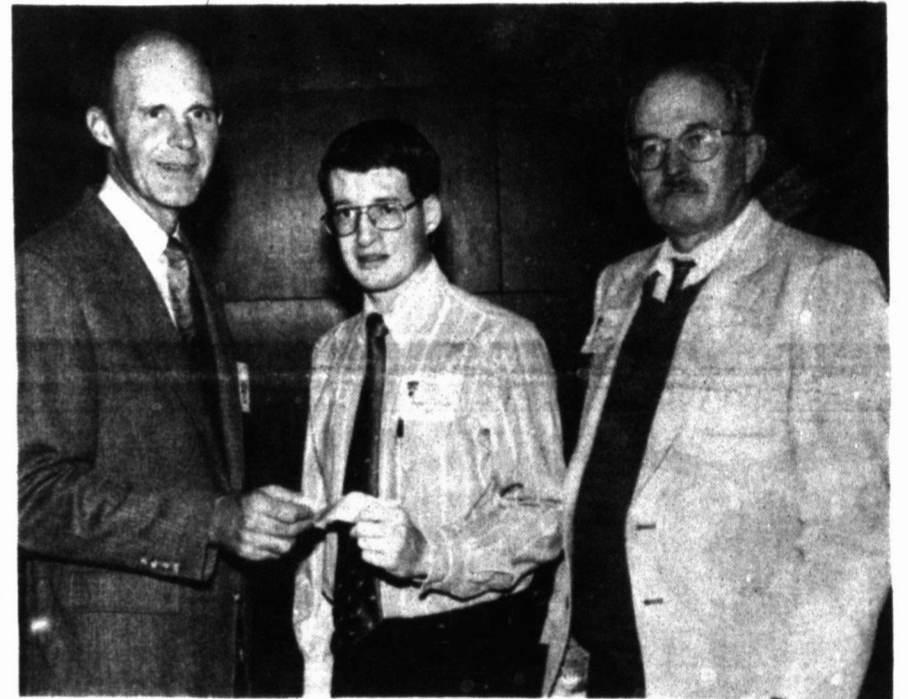
The surprise raid netted rock cocaine--commonly called "crack" and a quantity of marijuana. One person was charged with dealing in the hard drug, two with peddling "pot". Such sentences carries stiff penalties upon conviction. However, all three are now back out on the street, having posted bond.

Cotton Meeting and Computer/Forage Symposium

Farm Accounting Program Set

The Texas Agricultural Extension Service will have an introductory program on the accounting computer program Quicken 5th following the Cotton Production Seminar sponsored by BASF and Evans Fertilizer on Thursday, February 13, 1992. The seminar starts at noon with lunch, followed by a cotton production seminar given by Dr. Dan Krieg, cotton producer and professor at Texas Tech University. Dr. Steve Amosson, Extension Economist, will give an introductory to Quicken 5th following Dr. Kreig's program.

Quicken 5th is a simple, low-cost accounting program that has become increasingly popular with farmers and ranchers that utilize computers in their operations. Dr. Amosson will review the basics of cash record keeping with Quicken 5th and discuss other helpful features related to financial record keeping.

The program on Quicken 5th should start around 2:15 p.m. and end around 3:00 p.m.

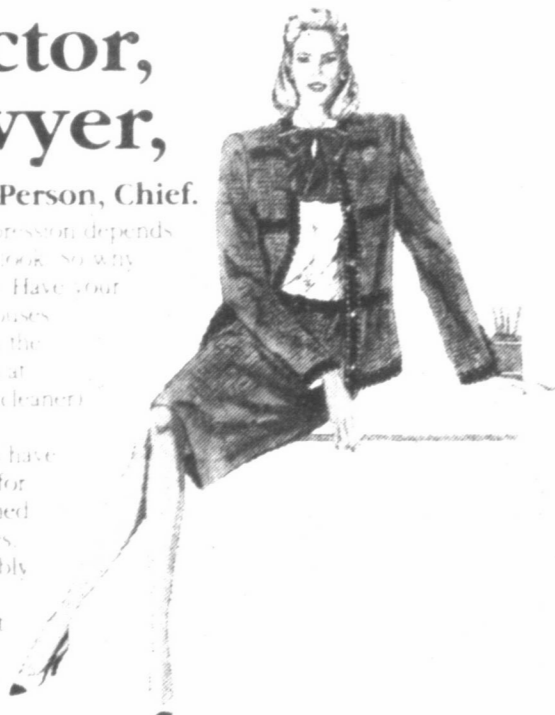

An Editorial:

Train Misses Car

Clarendon narrowly missed another intersection accident Monday morning shortly after 10:00. An elderly lady driving a maroon sedan crept across the railroad track on Kearney Street right in front of an empty, westbound, Burlington coal train pulled by six big six-axle locomotives. The engineer blasted away with the locomotive's horn, but neither the driver did nor her passenger gave any indication of hearing or seeing the on-coming locomotive. She stared straight ahead as her car crawled past the flashing lights right in front of the train. Fortunately the train was going slowly enough that it missed the automobile.

Reportedly--according to local residents who were listening to the scanner--the engineer had been reporting mechanical problems to the dispatcher in Springfield a few minutes before the incident. They speculate that those problems were the reason that the train was moving so slowly. If so, they may have saved two lives.

The Clarendon News has repeatedly run public service ads urging caution at railroad crossings. Crossing accidents are a leading cause of injury and death in Donley County. Yet far too many motorists cross the tracks with out thinking or looking or listening. When drivers ignore printed warnings, clanging bells, bright flashing red signal lights and loud, piercing locomotive horns, one wonders if anything can wake them up short of the shock of an actual collision. And the latter is such a needless waste of life!

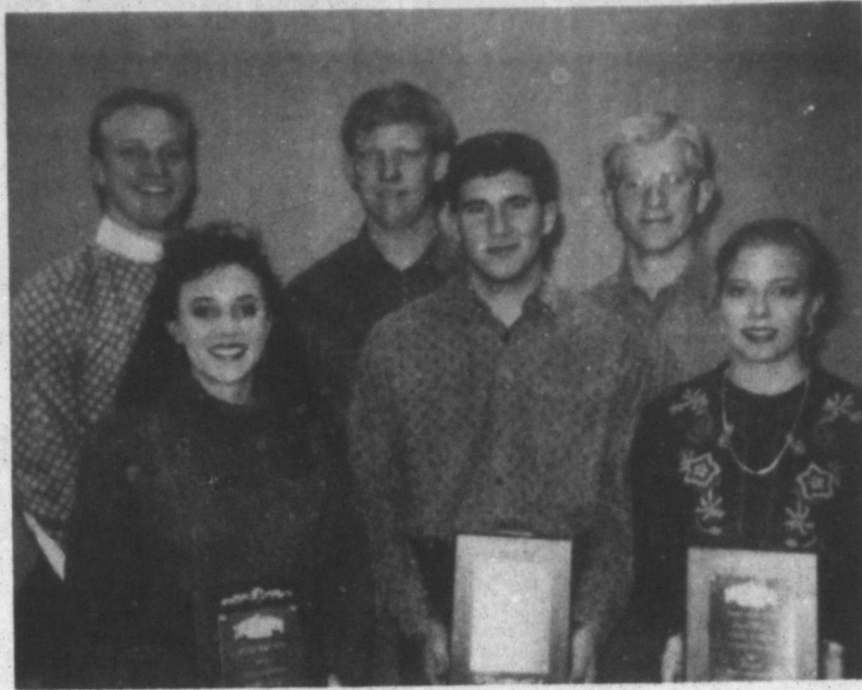

Association Meeting Set

The Panhandle Livestock Association - the oldest organization in Northwest Texas - will hold its 77th annual meeting Saturday, February 22, 1992 at the Harvey Hotel in Amarillo. The convention will begin at 9 a.m. with registration in the atrium. At 10:30 a.m. the Board of Directors will meet. At noon there will be a luncheon and fashion show, by Images in Pampa. Models will be Association members' wives. The guest speaker will be Mr. Jack Moreman, Director of Clarendon College Ranch and Feedlot Management School.

The Panhandle Livestock Association was formed in 1915 when 18 well known Panhandle cattlemen got together to form the Buyers and Sellers Livestock Association. The Association began when rail service came to Amarillo.

In 1908, the Santa Fe Railroad made application to the Texas Legislature for permission to abandon its line from Panhandle to Washburn and construct a shorter line from Panhandle to Amarillo.

The attorney for Santa Fe appeared before the lawmakers in support of the Panhandle-to-Amarillo route, but the proposition was voted down by a large majority of the legislators.

A prominent cattleman, J.H. Avery, then asked 187 Amarilloans to write legislators to request reconsideration of Santa Fe's application. On the second vote the

proposition passed by a large margin.

With the coming of the rail line, it was necessary for the cattlemen to organize. Mr. Avery wrote of the situation at that time: "From 1901 to 1909 the livestock shipments over the Santa Fe Railroad from West Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and Oklahoma was in a deplorable state, and most cattlemen were held up from a few days to two weeks at shipping points, waiting for stock cars, and a small percent were unable to get shipments out and had to return to their ranch, resulting in a long list of lawsuits."

Finally, the area cattlemen formed the Buyers and Sellers Association, soon changing its name to the Panhandle Livestock Association. Since then, the PLA has served the interests of Panhandle Cattlemen, including through conventions.

This year a new purpose seemed appropriate for the Association. A scholarship will be started at Clarendon College Ranch and Feedlot Management School for a young man or woman interested in the ranching industry. A silent auction, held during the cocktail party, fund this scholarship. The cocktail party and auction will begin at 6:30 p.m. A dance will follow beginning at 7:30 p.m. The Khiva Shrine Western Swing Band will provide the music. Breakfast will be served at 11:00 p.m. ending the day's events.

Reservations must be made by February 17th. Reservations for the entire day will be \$50.00 per person. Annual membership dues

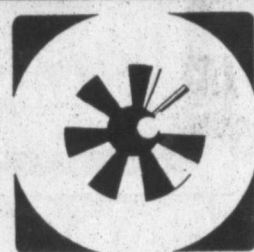

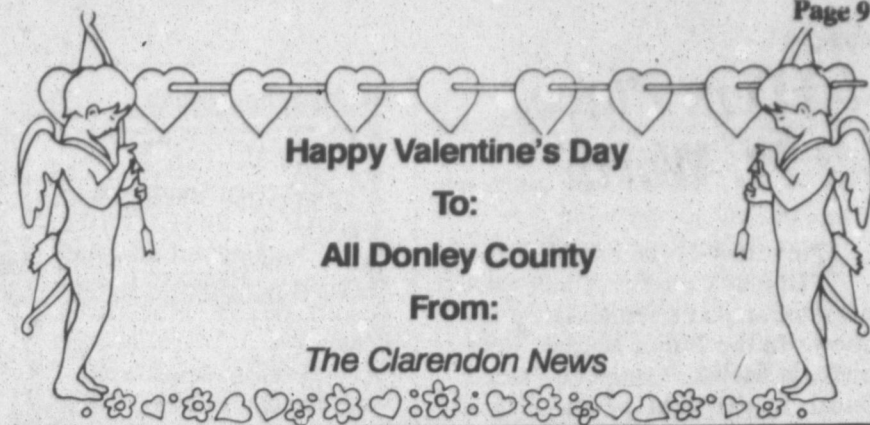

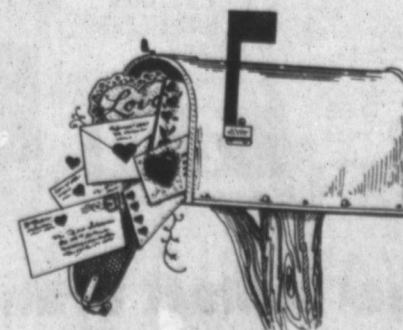

Locals Compete In Calf Scramble

Three local FFA members from Clarendon will compete in the 1992 Houston Rodeo calf scramble on February 28 in the Astrodome.

The calf scramble is an exciting part of the Houston rodeo action, featuring Vince Gill and Steve Wariner as part of that evening performance.

Kevin McAnear, 14-year-old son of Monte and Connie McAnear, Donny Howard, 14-year-old son of George and Sue Howard, and David Green, 15-year-old son of Don and Katherine Williams, will all compete for one of 252 calves to be awarded at the 1992 show.

Two youngsters from each of the 18 rodeo performances will be awarded "hard luck" certificates for their hearty efforts in attempting to catch a calf, resulting in 36 more certificates actually given.

The actual calf scramble event involves 28 energetic youngsters pitted against 14 vigorous calves. Each youngster is committed to capturing a calf, haltering and bringing it to the finish line-- but only the successful ones receive \$1,000 calf purchase certificates.

The certificates donated by a generous firm or individual firm, is used to purchase a purebred registered beef or dairy heifer. The calf is raised by the winner for special showing competition in the Astrodome at the following year's Show. The yearlong project is closely supervised by the appropriate county extension agent or agricultural science teacher.

Additionally, the winners are required to submit financial records, photographs, and a scrapbook to the calf scramble office to detail the progress of the venture. The youngsters are encouraged to provide updated reports to their donors as well.

All net proceeds from the annual Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo provide funds for scholarships and research projects throughout the state. Currently, more than 1,000 students receive

some form of Show-sponsored financial assistance. Almost 10,000 volunteers ensure the success of each year's event.

This year's event begins with horse show competition, Wednesday, February 12 followed by other livestock competition beginning Saturday, Feb. 15. The first rodeo performance will be held at 4 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 16. All events conclude March 1. Twenty-six star entertainment acts are scheduled to perform during the rodeo's run.

Saturday matinee performances begin at 11 a.m. and the Sunday, February 23 matinee performance begins at 1 p.m. The first and final Sunday performances, February 16 and March 1, will be held at 4 p.m. All evening performances begin at 7:30 p.m.
