are located in Pampa, Borger, Amarillo and Wheeler.
The Clarendon office, located at 111 Kearney, will employee six people, Wilkinson said. Those who wish more information should call

Wilkinson said that the Shepard's Elder Health Care Program will be offered to Clarendon patients also. Elder Health is a free service which checks, elderly to visit the Shepard's Crook office for blood pressure checks, blood sugar screening, and lung assessments. A health history file
is kept at the office andcan be used as is kept at the office andcan be used as a reference by the patient's
physicians. The program also offers the members assistance with flin Medicare or other insurance forms.
Wilkinson explained that a home health agency offers nurses, aides, and other healthcare professionals who work under a physician's orders to care for patients in the home. The majority of patients are elderly, but the
