## Emergency Farm Loan Applications Being Accepted

formency farm loans caused by drought that occurred on April 1, 2005, and continuing, are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency (FSA) office located in Anson," Richard G. Young said.
"Callahan is one of 19 contiguous counties in Texas recently named by the Secretary of Agriculture eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from drought hat occurred on April 1, 2005, and continuing.
Richard G. Young said, "Farmers may be eligible for loans of up to $100 \%$ of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private ommercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percent.
"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for a FSA emergency loan," Richard G. Young said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have o figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.
Applications for loans under the emergency designation will be accepted until September 25, 2006 but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create acklogs in processing and possibly over into the new arming season," Richard G. Young said
FSA is a credit agency of the United States Department of Agriculture, It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming or a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended individual farmers who meet U.S. citizen requirements and to farming partnerships, corporations or cooperatives in which U.S. citizenship requirements are met by holding a majority interest.
The FSA office in Anson is open from 8 a.m. to $4: 30$ p.m. Monday through Friday.
