Seniors lead CHS to UIL district title

Clarendon High School, led by a strong senior class, swept the University Interscholastic League competition by claiming the District championship and advancing 13 students to the Regional contest.

The students began preparing for UIL in September by attending the UIL Super Conference at Texas Tech University in Lubbock.

The students also attended two practice meets, the West Texas High Invitational and the Canadian Invitational. Those competing at these meets were successful, but the real success came at district, held at Amarillo College.

Thirty-eight CHS students competed at the District meet, and 16 students placed. Seniors who qualified for the Regional meet are: Taylor Shelton, first in News Writing, first in Current Issues and

Events, first in Headlines, and second in Editorials; Lacey Anderberg, first in Editorials and second in Persuasive Speaking; Valerie Taylor, first in Literary Criticism; Eric Pitts, first in Ready Writing; and Ashlee Kidd, second in Feature Writing.

These students competed at the 1-1A Regional Contest at South Plains College in Levelland. Taylor Shelton advanced to State with a first place finish in New Writing, as did Valerie Taylor with a second place finish in Literary Criticism. Lacey Anderberg placed sixth in Editorials.

Taylor and Valerie attended the State UIL meet at the University of Texas in Austin on May 2 and 3. Taylor placed first in News Writing, and Valerie got sixth in Literary Criticism.

The UIL contestants represented Clarendon well in 2003, continuing the tradition of excellence for the CHS academic team.






The Clarendon Lady Bronco softball team, led by coach Kathy Barton, was up and running full speed ahead in 2003.

In addition to all the shows and judging contests, FFA members worked hard in the Ag shop on numerous projects that helped to benefit all who attend Hedley School.







Hedley UIL brings home several honors

Hedley UIL academic teams had a good year and brought home a large number of medals in 2002/2003.

The year began back in October with a great showing for ten math and science students as they brought back two second-place trophies from the Lubbock Coronado Invitational Meet out of 12 strong 1A-3A schools. Stephen Howard was first in Number Sense and second in Math; Treva Rowland, first in Science; Lacey Wallendorff, second in Science and second in Math for Juniors; Lauren Hill, third in Calculator Applications and third in Mathematics; and Travis Hrbacek, second in Freshman Science. Collectively, the teams brought back a third-place "sweepstakes" placing, the school's highest in a major meet.

In January, Hedley competed with 1A through 4A schools at the West Texas Invitational Meet in Stinnett. The Calculator Applications team placed first, paced by Lauren Hill's first-place individual finish. Treva Rowland and Brittney Bennett finished third and fourth individually. The Science team again placed second overall and the Number Sense team third overall, led by Stephen Howard's third-place individual score.

More medals were won in February at the Canadian Invitational Meet as Stephen Howard won both Number Sense and Math contests. Rebekah Howard medalled with a third-place finish in Lincoln-Douglas Debate. Sealey Stevens led the Current Issues and Events team to a

Stevens and Howard qualified for the UIL State Academic Meet in Austin. This was the sixth year in a row Hedley has qualified at least one student to compete at state.
