## Texas Economy Growing

A ccording to an upbeat report by State Comptroller John Sharp, Texas month of October. The figures confirm local sentiment that October was a good month.
Donley County receipts were up 61.25 per cent for October Sales, and up 6.53 per cent for the year-to-date. Statewide numbers were 20.37 per cent and 5.15 per cent, respectively. However, the statewide figures are
inflated somewhat by tax rate increases in many counties in the past year. inflated somewhat by tax rate increases in many counties in the past year.
Clarendon was up 66.59 per cent compared to October '91, and up 4.46 per cent compared to the first ten months of that year. Howardwick was up 30.48 per cent and 18.62 per cent. There were no monthly figures
for Hedley, by its YTD figures were up 27.91 per cent, a very healthy increase.

Many area towns booted . These included Childress, Panhandle, Wellington, Pampa and Mer Amarillo Borger and Quitaque raised their sales tax rate earlier. Such increases invalidate the percentage increases as an indicator of economic activity. Most of these did have sales increases in the period, however. Armstrong County (Claude)was up 39.39 and 3.15. Briscoe (Quita-
que and Silverton) was up 177.42 and 21.45. Hemphill (Canadian) was 6.35 per cent for October, but down 10.72 YTD. Hutchinson County (Borger, Fritch, etc.) was up 9.09 and down .54 per cent. Motley County (Matador, Roaring Springs) was up 7.06 and 12.92.

"Sadly, we tend to overlook ire prevention during the holidays, which makes the loss to fires during December especially painful," saic
Executive Director Michael E Hines. "Last Christmas season, five people died in fires involving acci-
dents with Christmas trees. More ents with Christmas trees. More than $\$ 850,000$ in property damage fires." Last December, 511 fires in volved Christrastrees and another 13 fires involved holiday decoraIns, according to the Texas Fire Incident Reporting System
operated by the commission to gather fire statistics from Texas fire departments. The most common
causes of holiday fires were candles and electrical malfunctions, especially involving lamps and lights.
Fireworks were involved in 79 fires that caused property amage estimated at $\$ 175,000$ January 1992, Hines said.
