USDA-ASCS Provide Marketing Provisions
Farmers participating in the 1992 Farm Program are eligible for loans and loan deficiency payments (LDP) if Fertain conditions are met. The Donley County loan rate for 1992 cotton is $\$ .5240$ per pound. The LDP payment changes every week, depending on the Adjusted World Market Price (AWP), but is currently about \$.12
per pound.
Loan and LDP Eligibility: For a commodity to be eligible for a loan or a loan deficiency payment (LDP), the producer must have beneficial interest in the commodity in addition to other eligibibily requirements. Beneficial Interest: A producer retains beneficial interest in the commodity if
the producer: a)control of the commodity; b)risk of loss; c) title to the commodity.
For LDP's, the producer must retain beneficial interest in the commodity from the time of harvest through the date the loan is redeemed or Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) takes title to the commodity. For loans, the producer must retain beneficial interest in the commodity from the time of harvest through Selling Equity: If a producer receives any payment that would give the buyer any share of the equity in the commodity, such commodity is immediately ineligible for a loan or an LDP. If a producer sells any equity in the commodity after it has been pledged as collateral for a loan, repayment of the loan principal and charges plus
interest is required. Option to Main
Option to Maintain Benefícial Interest: An option to purchase is an agreement allowing the buyer, at the buyer's option to enter into contract at a later date to buy

Payments: If a producer bas entered into na option to purchase the producer may receive a payment and beneficial interest if such option to purchase has been approved by the local ASCS office.
