## Disease Detectives Stalk Virus

$H^{\text {antavirus, the microbe responsible for the mystery disease that }}$ recently surfaced in New Mexico and the Four Corners Area, isn new. But Like so many agents that cause the disease, the virus is snacaky.
Fified as a source of human disease in the mid-1970 Hantaviruses cause a severe and sometimes fatal respiratory illness. Ro dents appear to be natural hosts for hantaviruses. In rodents, however
hantaviruses produce a lifelong infection without apparent disease. They shed the virus through excretions. Contact with the excretions is thought to be the primary way humans become infected.
The virus does not seem to spread from person to person. The and the time of year humans may be the most likely to come in contact with rodents, especially airborne particles of their droppings or urine. Although any one may become infected with the hantavirus, it is most common among young adults.

They monitor state, national, and international disease reports, forming a worldwide surveillance network. They track In the current Hantavirus episode, they noticed a cluster of illness in he Four Corners area that involved a common element-- rapid respiratory tilure, a trademark of the virus.
Epidemiologists from the state health departments in Arizona,
Colorado, New Mexico, and Utah, plus others from the Colorado, New Mexrico, and Utah, plus others from the Indian Health diately began the investigation. Soon they found evidence to link the illness a kind of Hantavirus associated with decrmice, common rodents in the
