Burton Memorial Library Accredited

G.B.Burton Memorial Library of Clarendon was recently accredited as a member of the Texas Library System for fiscal year 1994, according to William D. Gooch, Director and Librarian of the Texas State Library.

certificate of system membership in recognition of the efforts this community has made in providing public library services," said Gooch. "It is a symbol of having achieved a level of excellence."

Burton Memorial Library is a member of the Texas Panhandle

"We are pleased to award a Library System and serves citizens in Donley County and the surrounding area. It had to meet strict criteria, according to Librarian, Mary Linn Bills, such as hours of access, professional staffing requirements, number of library materials, and local per capita support to become an accredited

member. Public libraries must apply and qualify for system membership annually. The Burton Memorial Library has been a member of the Texas Panhandle Library System for 16 years.

Among the benefits Donley County Citizens enjoy through membership in the Texas Library System are Interlibrary Loan which makes available books owned by other libraries worldwide; area loan of 200 fiction books at a time from Amarillo Public Library; rotating packets of talking books and large print books; reference research service; consultation services of the Texas Panhandle System staff; and annual grants for collection development. This year's grant is in the amount of \$2,416 and is based on population and recent

expenditures of local funds for col-

lection development.

Authorized by the Library Systems Act of 1969, the Texas Library System was developed to improve library service in the state through cooperative efforts. Comprised of ten regions, the statewide system provides an opportunity for local libraries to make the best possible use of both their own resources and those available elsewhere in the sustem. These cooperative efforts are made possible through state and federal funds appropriated to the Library Development Program of the Texas State Library. This year the Texas State Library will distribute about \$7.7 million to the ten library systems.

"Citizens of Clarendon and Donley County can take special pride in our library," says Mary Linn Bills, Library Director. "We are constantly aware of and thankful for the sacrifice, planning, and effort which have gone into making Burton Memorial Library what it is today. In addition, the Clarendon City Council and the Donley County Commission are to be commended for continuing to fulfill the requirements for Texas Library System membership so that citizens may have the invaluable benefits it provides."

School Considers Head Start

Readiness for school is a key ingredient for later school success. The Head Start program is designed to give children that needed assistance to get them ready for school. The district feels that a Head Start program would enhance the ability of participating students to be much more successful in school. For these reasons Clarendon CISD is considering adding this four-year-old program for the 1994-95 school year.

In order to qualify for a Head Start unit, Clarendon CISD must determine that there is a need for this type of assistance. This need will be determined by the number of families that qualify based on family incomes. The 1993 Family Income Guidelines for children to be eligible to participate in the Head Start program are as follows:

Austree: A Tree For All Reasons

The Austree is an excellent tree for windbreaks, shade trees, hedges or a privacy screen. The Austree naturally grows in a dense formation, however, it can easily be pruned for a shade tree. No pruning should be necessary for the first season. In the spring of the second season, simply find the tallest and straightest main leader. Out all other limbs at ground level and discard. You can prune all small branches from the ground up, about one third of the height of the trees. For example, if you have a six foot main leader, you could prune all lower branches up to two feet.

Austrees are sensitive to chemical fertilizers and if used should be

applied at least two months before planting. The SWCD cannot take orders for this tree after December 10th. If you need further information concerning trees, please stop by their office at 4th & Sully. SWCD is a non profit organization who's sole concern is the conservation of our natural resources.
