${ }^{6}$ Will it be there when I need eard most often during my 28 year career with Social Security. And it's one I know rlll be asked many more times in the future. My answer is simple, straightforward, and confi-
dent: of course it will! Id like to share my confidence with the readers of this newspaper, especially young to middle-aged
workers, who have lost workers, who have lost faith in the Social Security system.
n the system? Why do they believe they will see little if any return for all the Social Security taxes they're paying? I think much of their pes-
simism stems from misleading eports about those taxes being used to finance other government
programs or from allegations that programs or from allegations that contain only "worthless 10 'S's's $^{\prime}$. skepticism is rooted in nisunderstanding of the concept of "social insurance" and in inappropriate comparisons between
Social Security and private investment programs.
To help set the record straight, let's start with the basics. Out of every dollar paid in Social
Security taxes: 73 cents goes to a trust fund that pays monthly benefits to about 8 million retiree and their families and to about 8 milion widows, widowers, and 19 cents goes to a trust fund that pays for the health care of 34 milcents goes to a trust fund that pay wenefits to about 5 million people Money not needed to hese benefits is invested in U.S. overnment bonds, generally conents. And safest of all investhe money it has borrowed from ocial Security, just as it uses the money that you may have invested Treasurv bond. to pav for all its projects and services. And just a he government pays you back with nterest when you redeem your
oonds, it has always mado good on its obligations to Social Security There's no reason to believe it won't continue to do so. If you own Treasury bonds, it's a safe bet that you don't consider them to be
"worthless IOU's." Social Security doesn't either. Our investments will be honored and we in turn will honor your investments in Social Security. It will be there when you tion: When will you need it? People who think of Social Security in terms of only a retirement annunity don't understand what the program is all about. Tobetter grasp the true
value of Social Security not only to yourself and your family, but to society as a whole, you must recog nize the difference between private surance" system like social Security. looked non-retirement benefits are especially significant to young people. Of course, we all expect to stay healthy and work right up to he day we retire. But the fact is that about 42 percent of men and 28 percent of women will die or betheir retirement years. If the unthinkable happens, Social Security will be there for you and your fami17. met its fundamental social goals There is no single program, public or private, that has protected the financial well-being of as many Americans as Social Security
Today, more than 42 millio people, nearly one in six of our citizens, receives a Social Security check each month. Of those beneficiaries over age 65 , about 36 percent are kept from living in Security benefits. Some argue that they would do better financially i they could invest an amount equal private sector. Undoubtedly, some people would invest their money wisely, avoid disability or early death, and realize a greater return on their investment than they coul
