Field Day Scheduled for Lucky Ranch, Near Albany, On June 21st

ALBANY — H. R. Stasney's Lucky Ranch, near Albany, will be the site of a field day co-sponsored by Area IV Young Farmers Association, SCS Lower Clear Fork SWCD, and the Texas Section, Society for Range Management, on Thursday, June 21, during the famous Pandangle for those who would like to attend both. The Lucky Ranch has a High Intensity Low Frequency rotation grazing system in operation since July 1969, which is now stocked at the rate of 5.5 acres per animal unit. This is more than three times the original stocking rate.

All interested persons are invited to assemble at the court house in Albany at 10 o'clock and caravan to the ranch house where transportation for the tour will be furnished. At 12, a dutch treat barbecue will be served by the Pandangle caterer.

At one o'clock the afternoon program will convene in the high school auditorium with Carl Ryden, President of the Stephenville Young Farmers chapter presiding. After intro-

ductory remarks by Jack Fambro, president of the Lower Clear Fork Soil and Water Conservation Board and representatives of Texas Young Farmers and the range society, Lendon Parker, SCS District Conservationist at Albany, will discuss the history and development of the Lucky Ranch HILF system. Doug Sellars, SCS Range Specialist from Stephenville, will review the system with slides and Lynn Post, SCS Area Biologist from Stephenville, will discuss Wildlife Response to HILF Grazing Systems. Mack Woolridge, ranch and business manager for H. R. Stasney, will participate in a question and answer period about the Lucky Ranch grazing system. Joe B. Morris, SCS Range Specialist of Abilene, will give a Summary of Results with HILF Systems across Texas to complete the day.

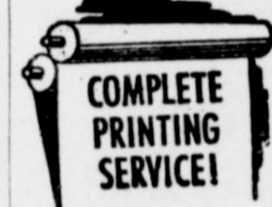

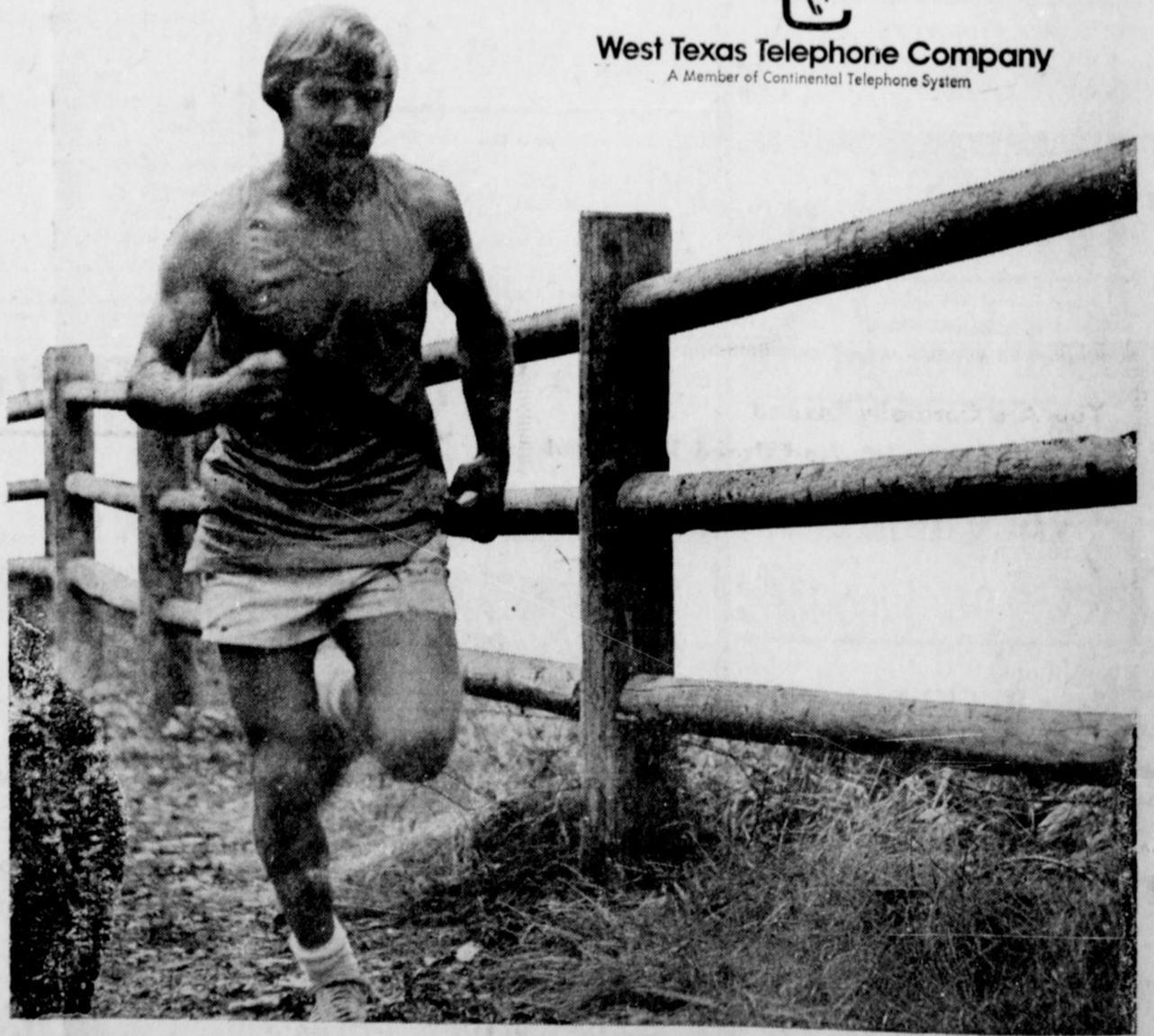
