

What kind of picture could this year end with? The 2,921 traffic deaths already recorded plus 363 deaths similar to last December would give a total of 3,284 traffic deaths. The Sergeant stated it is estimated that this year's traffic death count will be about 15 per cent over 1965.

SCREWWORM PROBLEM -Screwworm flies which are infiltrating into Texas may force the Texas Animal Commission to pass a regulation to keep the insects South of the border.

Currently, infected cattle are not allowed to be imported into Texas. But they are kept at the border where the insects hatch and fly across the Rio Grande anyway.

Commission is considering a rule prohibiting the import into Texas of any cattle from a herd in which diseased cattle are found.

This rule, it is reasoned, will force the importer to return his entire herd to the ranch, thus keeping the screwworm larvaes away from the border. No action has been taken, and none will be necessary if ranchers take steps on their own.
