Austin, Tex Oct 8, The aggregate amount of penalties to be sued for in the forty-nine case againt the several railway and express companies operating in this State, which District Attorney Warren Moore is prepariug to file in the District Court here, is about $\$ 500,000$, including the penalties asked for in the four suits of this character which were filed in the District Court here yesterday
