etails Of Fighting.
Chefoo, Nov. 3.-When the Japanese drove the Russians from the strong positions on the last range of hills in front of the fortress by surprise attac July 30 the Russians retired to the forts, but they also strongly held previously prepared ad ance lines to prevent the Jap anese from closing up the forti fied ridges. The division wa ordered to take Taku and Shahku mountains August and bombardment began in th fternoon. Eight Japanese reg iments gained a foothold on the crests of Taku mountains and after a desperate hand-to-hand encounter compelled the Rus sians to retire westward into their permanent forts. The Japanese regiments then com bined for an attack on Shahku mountain, but were repulse and compelled to spend the night in their trenches in the foot hills. At 11 o'clock in the morning the attack was renew ed and the hills captured. Th Russians left hundreds of dead on the abandoned positions ourteen hundred.
Japan's Worst Enemy.
One of the most serious proplems
confronting the Japanese army sur-
geons at the seat of war in the pre-
valence of beri-beri. It is stated
that the losses from this disease ex-
ceed the total casualties in the fight-
ing. Every transport bound for
Japan takes hundreds of sufferers.
One general has been invalided by
the disease. The beseigers of Port
Arthur are suffering the worst, and
it is said that between this disease
and casualties one division has been
almost extinguished. The cause
of the outbreak is unkown, though
believers in the nitrogen-starvation
theory of the desease find support
for their views in the epidemic.
At Waco Thursday, Melvin Pe-
ters, charged with false swearing in
cases where he secured a considera-
ble sum of money from the Inter-
national and Great Northern rail-
way by claiming that he had been
injured while in the service of the
road, pleaded guilty and was sen-
tenced to two years in the peniten-

For the information of those who may be concerned, and with hum ble apologies to the public for any semblance which this article may have to a reply or manifestation of osh directed at the Commissioner Court of this county, and whic bears upon its face the unmistaka be evidence of a colicky sensatio due to an overdose of sour grapes, nvy and egotism, which is ver often mistaken by "the aggrived or a spirit of "truth and justice," we authorize the publication of the ollowing statement, which is sup ported by the records, and is like wise made with due regard for va acity and the facts in the case In considering the matter of filling he vacancy caused by the death of our late County Judge, there wa an aspirant for the office who gra-
cously offered himself as a sacrifice ciously offered himself as a sacrifice
in "the ring," and the Commis sioners Court, in the plentitude its power, saw fit to thwart thi noble sacrifice, and to tender the position to the present incumbent,
who was not an applicant for the same, believing that he possesse qualifications which best fitted him to assume this trust.
Subsequently there were certain repairs made in and about the
court house, and an additional book case purchased for the use of the county, all of which, in the opin ion of the court, was necessary for
the preservation of the county the preservation of the county
property. The Commissioners
Court room, which is also used for Court room, which is also used for
an office for the County Judge, wa
an office for the County Judge, was
treated to a new floor and four
window blinds. This enormou
at the instance of the incoming
judge, but upon an order made by

the members or the Commissioners
office, and Mr. Morgan, therefore,
nad no voice whatever in this ac-
tion of the Court.
The matter of need of an addi-
tional book case to take the place
