however, thater however, that a great many coundeos have tax rates of less than a lowering their rates this year. For
instance:
Dawson County has reduced its rate efom 83 cents to 76 cents.
Floyd County has reduced its Floyd County has reduced its
rate from 69 cents to 64 cents. Gillespie County has reduced its rate from 66 cents to 62 cents.
Hale County has reduced its rate from 65 cents to 53 cents. Every county should be inter-
ested in getting its tax rate to the ested in getting its tax rate to the
