

The disease known as the Glanders, has broken out in Sterling, Ill. It is said to be as contageous, as small pox and as likely to effect men as horses. Medical and other attendants upon horses afflicted with it are liable to take the disease. Nothing but the entire destruction of the animals, with stables and articles used about sick animals, will prevent its spread.

Twelve companies have been formed in Edinburg, Scotland, during the past year for dealing in American land and cattle. One of them has paid 25 per cent dividend. This is presumed to be the one first organized, and its success led to imitation. Prices paid for land are said to be 20 to 50 per cent more than Americans would have given .- [Galveston News

The recent shipment of stack cattle; rom their LaSalle county ranch, is the subject of much discussion among stockmen, being the first large shipment eyer undertaken from this [section of the state. Mr. Florence Hall, of Gainesville, will ship 2,500 head to the same point. In a conversation with Mr. Millett he stated that his stock went through in good shape without a loss. The stock went through in three days, including a rest of 12 hours at Taylor. The complete success of this shipment will likely induce others to follow suit who wish to transfer stock from this section to the Panhandle region.

Pleuro-pneumonia.

J. H. Sanders, member of the treasury cattle commission, states that there are no cases of foot or mouth disease among the cattle in America or Canada, and the only cases of that character in this country are direct from England. A little over a year ago a few cases were brought here, but were discovered in time, the cattle placed in quarantine, and the spread of the disease prevented. He discribes the disease as being very contageous, but easily cured.

A Company of Cowboys.



One of the young men, Will Cardwell can rope and tie down a wild steer in one minute and five seconds, Will Roach, in one minute and twenty-five seconds and J. C. Witter, third best, in two and a quarter minutes. The organization will take all necessary stock with them on their northern tour. This is the first company of the kind that ever was put on the amusement list, and will undoubtedly draw large crowds, especially in the distant North where the very name of FURNITURE, a cowboy has carried terror with it. It will give people in the cities a very fair idea of cowboy life and adventures and experiences .- [Journal.
